I Thessalonians 4:2-5 For you know what commandments we gave you by the authority of the Lord Jesus. 3 For this is the will of God, your sanctification; that is, that you abstain from sexual immorality; 4 that each of you know how to possess his own vessel in sanctification and honor, 5 not in lustful passion, like the Gentiles who do not know God;

This weekend a number of our young people will be going along with about 1300 other teenagers to Evangelism University in Savannah, TN. Natalie and I are going to help instruct in some of the classes for these young people who are focusing on spreading the good news of the gospel. I will be on a panel discussing the need to properly handle temptations. I believe it to be a great topic for young people because one of the biggest turn offs to Christianity is when those outside of the faith see believers who give in to temptations to live as the world.

Paul plainly teaches in I Thessalonians 4 it is God's will for us to be separate from the world and one of the ways we do this is by staying away from sexual immorality. In the world this behavior is rampant, but in God's kingdom it is to be absent. While this is a strong temptation to young and old alike, we are called on to realize our bodies are the vessels of God's Holy Spirit and that they have been bought with a price ICorinthians 6:19,20). We must glorify God with our bodies. That is also why He told them not to associate with anyone who is a Christian who is guilty of sexually immorality (I Corithians 5:9). God knew if His people give in to the desires of the flesh, participating, and allowing sexual immorality within the church it would bring much harm. Not only would the individuals involved be in danger of judgment, but our ability to draw others to the Lord would be greatly hampered. May we all do our best to fight for purity within our lives.

Two Things That Don't Make Sense

Proverbs 11:22 Like a gold ring in a pig's snout is a beautiful woman who shows no discretion.

In Biblical days, women wore jewelry even more than today. One item that they wore that is not typical today is nose rings. Of course it could be out of various materials but the most valuable ones were made of gold. The nose ring would be obvious to anyone who looked at the woman and it was certainly easy to see that it was made of gold. Would the same ring be place in a pig's snout? Rings are placed in a pig's snout in order to prevent him from rooting with his nose. It would not make sense to place a gold ring in its snout. This object of beauty does not belong on a pig.

The second illustration is concerning beautiful women. Solomon does not clarify as to whether it is inner beauty or outer beauty but both certainly apply. The beautiful woman will be as easily seen as the gold ring worn for jewelry. What does not make sense is a beautiful woman that does not show discretion. What is discretion? One definition is the ability to behave without causing embarrassment or attracting too much attention. A second meaning is the quality of behaving or speaking in such a way as to avoid causing offense or revealing private information. It includes being careful about what you say and showing a great sense of levelheadedness. A beautiful woman that creates embarrassment or isn't careful about what she says or simply calls a lot of attention to herself will quickly lose her beauty. As children of God, inner beauty is to be an attractant to people. Let all of us, both male and female, make ourselves attractive by living out godly principles.
