Are you ready to give an answer?

But sanctify the Lord God^[d] in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear;

I Peter 3:15

In preparing for the trip to New Zealand here in a few weeks, I was sent a questionnaire by the brethren there about a number of my beliefs when it comes to God's word. The questions ranged from my view of the Bible, to membership, the Holy Spirit, issues about worship, and how a Christian should behave in various circumstances. I was excited to answer the questions because I thought it would be a good exercise for me to practice the principle of I Peter 3:15. God's word encourages us to always be ready to make a defense of the reason that we have hope, and I thought this would help me to be able to do that in a better way.

The questionnaire ended up being a 4 page document, and I still did not give full answers for each of the questions due to the complexity of some of them. Linda Lasater and I both filled them out and were blessed by the opportunity to do so. This process was a good challenge and learning process for us, and it lead me to ask you a few questions. 1. Are you ready to give an answer? There are various levels of readiness. How ready are you? 2. What could you do to improve your readiness? Is there a subject you have been thinking about that you need to put in some study? 3. Are you looking for opportunities to give an answer. It doesn't matter how ready a player is if he/she never takes the field. Let's make sure we are doing our best to be prepared to give an answer, and lets make sure we get out there and look for opportunities to share our answers.

Unjust Judges

Psalm 82:1 God presides in the great assembly; he gives judgment among the "gods".

Every society has the need for judges. In our verse today the word "gods" is a reference to judges. It was a high and respected position then as it is even today. "Gods' seems rather appropriate as this position so easily allows an individual to think more highly of self than they should. Accusations are made against these judges: first they were defending the unjust and secondly they were showing partiality to the wicked. No longer was the rule of law (God's law) considered but rather the thoughts and opinions of the judge. Bribes are not mentioned in this Psalm but often throughout the Old Testament warnings are given to judges to not accept bribes. What should the judges be doing?

The Psalmist called upon judges to defend the cause of the weak and the fatherless. They were to maintain the rights of the poor and the oppressed. They were also charged to rescue the weak and the needy. Judges were to administer justice. Instead the Psalmist declared that they understood nothing; they walk in darkness and the foundations of the earth are shaken. The nation was crumbling because judges were not doing their duty.

The Israelite judges were warned. They were all sons of the Most High. They will answer to God for their treatment of the law and of people. They were reminded that they will die; they are mere men. Judges are accountable to God - the judge of the earth. This judge will do what is right and fair.
