And Do Not Grumble

I Corinthians 10:10 And do not grumble, as some of them did - and were killed by the destroying angel.

Paul used a reference from the book of Numbers to make a point with Christians. Grumbling is not often considered to be a serious sin with men but it is seen so differently by God. In Numbers, a group of men spoke against Moses and his leadership. Because of this rebellion 250 men lost their lives. The next day the whole Israelite community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. These two godly men were accused of killing the Lord's people. The Lord was angry and sent a plague among the Israelites. In all, 14,700 people die from the plague and the number would have been much higher if Moses had not stood between the living and the dead. People died because of grumbling. Grumbling is a serious sin. We would do well to learn from this account.

Some Christians grumble against the leadership within a congregation. Some grumble about the preacher or about what is preached. Others grumble about the programs or lack of programs within the local congregation. Grumbling and complaining would fall within the same category. It is interesting that a few verses talk about the Israelites grumbling within their tents. Grumbling within our homes is heard by the Lord. If children are in the home then they also hear and are affected by it. Grumbling also leads to a poorer attitude the more that it is done. When we find ourselves unsatisfied then discuss the situation, strive to improve what bothers you and help to make changes. Don't just sit back and complain. Grumbling unleashed the destroying angel then and is harmful to the Christian life today.
