I Corinthians 15:32 If I fought wild beasts in Ephesus for merely human reasons, what have I gained? If the dead are not raised, "Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die."

How deep are your beliefs in the resurrection? I Corinthians 15 contains a long discussion by the apostle Paul concerning the resurrection and the reasons to believe in it. The resurrection of Jesus Christ makes all the difference in what we believe and why we believe in it. What a person believes about the resurrection determines much about his philosophy in life.

Paul had a deep belief and conviction in the resurrection. He staked his life on it numerous times. In Ephesus, he fought wild beasts. I take literally what he declared. Some interpret this to refer to men in Ephesus. They acted like wild beasts in wanting the destruction of Paul. Whether it was an animal or a man, Paul faced death and he stood his ground because of the resurrection. If there is no resurrection then he would have tried to escape the deathly situation.
