I am a child of the King

Last week I began a series of articles looking at the importance of how we identify ourselves. We know how we identify ourselves can have an affect on how we view ourselves. If you were asked to identify the greatest thing about you what would you mention? Would it be your family, your current talents, your job, or your successes in this world? These would be common answers to this kind of question, but I want you to consider one aspect of these types of answers. They are all temporary and fleeting. All of these things are important to us, but none of them are guaranteed to always be around. The one I want you to consider today can be carried through this life and into the next. I am a child of the King!

Romans 8:14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God... you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father." ¹⁶ The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷ and if children, then heirs—heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ,

When we identify ourselves based on our relationship with God it changes everything. I am His child! He is my Father! I am an heir of God! He believes I am valuable, and my inheritance is coming! He loves, cares, and wants what is best for me. As his child, he will look out for me, protect me and save me! Nothing in this world can take away the fact that I am a child of the King!

Advancing the Gospel

Philippians 1:12 Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel.

What had happened to Paul? On the occasion of this writing Paul was in the Roman prison. He often was thrown into prison including once in Philippi. This prison has possibly been uncovered. If it was the same that Paul was in then it was just a small cave with iron bars across the front. Metal rods were driven into the rock to which chains were attached. Paul and Silas were chained and shackled in prison at Philippi after being beaten. Numerous other situations arose in Paul's life that no one would ask for or desire to happen. How did Paul view these situations?

Everything that happened to Paul, whether good or bad, was used to further the gospel. In Rome, Paul was able to talk to the palace guard. He explained that he was in prison because of his belief in Jesus Christ. He told them about the Lord and some listened. In Philippi, the jailer was converted and baptized because he talked about Jesus. When shipwrecked on the island of Malta, the sailors and the islanders were able to learn about Jesus and souls were saved. We can say that Paul did not like to be beaten, stoned, shipwrecked or imprisoned but he still used these circumstances to talk about Jesus. The question to ask ourselves this day is this: "Am I advancing the gospel in whatever state I find myself in?" Life can have some hard twists to it. This will often bring new people into our lives. Do we share the message of the gospel? By sharing the gospel people will have the opportunity to believe the message but it will also provide encouragement to our fellow Christians to always speak up for the Lord. Are we looking for some opportunities? They are there if we will just open our eyes.
