I am a Church Member

As we continue to consider how we identify ourselves, let's look at how we are members of the Lord's church. On a broad sense, every Christian is member of the church universal. Romans12:5 tells us "so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another." We are part of a world-wide group of Christians whose purpose is to serve and glorify the Lord, but we are also a member of the Lord's body here at South Gate. How should this be a part of our identity?

Secondly, as a church member, have you allowed God to place you where he needs you at South Gate. May we all find our role at South Gate and make it an indispensable part of our identity.

Christ Exalted

Philippians 1:20 I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body whether by life or by death.

Paul was sitting in prison awaiting a hearing before Caesar. In confinement, he was full of faith and hope. He did not know what awaited him for the future but he did know that he wanted to be within God's will. Paul did not want to cause himself nor the Lord any shame. Certainly, he did not want the Lord to be ashamed of him or that God would turn against him. What did his future hold? Would he be released as he had previously or would this be the time that he would lose his life? Paul left this in the hands of God. His inner desires were presented in the next verse as he proclaimed that to live is Christ and to die is gain. The one and only concern was to exalt Christ by whatever happened. Paul wanted Christ to be glorified - magnified - exalted by his life.

Paul had no desire to promote himself but rather Jesus Christ. He wanted to do God's will nothing more and nothing less. As a Christian, is our goal to exalt the Lord? Using our bodies - the things we do, the things we say and the worship offered should exalt the Lord. Paul would even go so far as to say that whatever we eat or drink should be for the glory of God. He reminded the Corinthians that they were bought with the price of Jesus' blood. For this reason, they as well as we are to honor God with our bodies. Let's exalt his name in all that we do.
