## I Am A Sinner

This is a difficult thing to say, isn't it? Although, we easily admit to the fact that we all sin, it can still be very difficult to admit to individual sins with which we struggle. Yet, this admission is key to healing, forgiveness and faithfully repenting from sin in a Christian's life. Why is this so difficult? I would like to discuss some reasons in the next few weeks that make an admission of guilt difficult for us.

**I. Pride** - This characteristic keeps many from humbling themselves enough to admit to sin in their lives. Scripture tells us time and again that God hates a proud look Ecclesiastes 6:17, but He extends grace to the humble James 4:6. We must see, admit to, and express our own sinfulness in order to keep our proud, self-serving tendencies to melt into humble admission of our faults.

**II. Perfection Complex** – We are tempted everyday to buy into the idea that everyone else has everything together and so should we. As we succumb to this idea we start to worry more about appearances than about righteousness. We do all we can to keep up a façade of perfection instead of an honest approach to our sinfulness, and this only hurts us. A person must worry more about how God sees them than about how others see them in order to be able to admit their sinfulness. John encouraged the religious people of his day to see themselves as God sees them in order "to bring fruits worthy of repentance." Matthew 3:8. I believe he would encourage us toward the same thing today as well.

### The Pattern

**Philippians 3:17** Join with others in following my example, brothers, and take note of those who live according to the pattern we gave you.

Patterns are found all around us. There are patterns for making clothing; patterns for building a house and patterns in mathematics. In Scriptures patterns were used in various ways. God gave the plans for the tabernacle as well as the articles within it. David gave the pattern for the new temple to his son Solomon. Have you considered that there are patterns for the church and for Christian living?

Paul declared that he set them an example - that is a pattern. They were to learn from his life how to live theirs. Paul taught men God's word and expected them to teach the same to others. That is setting a pattern. When the pattern is not followed, then an act of rebellion has been committed.

What patterns are there for the church? A study of the book of Acts reveals a pattern for salvation. By studying the conversions, we learn that people heard the word, believed, confessed, repented and were baptized. There was a pattern for organization. The church had elders, deacons and evangelists. Qualifications were given for elders and deacons so that down to this day the pattern continues. The early church was very evangelistic. A pattern was set that should be carried on to this day. The earliest members of the church met to pray, to break bread, to listen to the apostle's teaching and to have fellowship. This set a pattern. We long to practice New Testament Christianity just like the pattern set by the first century Christians. Make note of those following this practice and follow them as they follow the pattern set long before them.
