I Corinthians 15:33 Do not be misled: "Bad company corrupts good character."

O that each generation would learn this important bit of wisdom. It matters who you spend your time with. If you spend your time with drug users, then in a matter of time you will also be involved. If all of your buddies use bad language, then it won't be long that you will at least be thinking those words if not saying them. He was not involved in the robbery and murder but by being with these men he was considered as one of the criminals. Many, many years later he was pardoned. Look at what one thoughtless choice did to his life. To keep good character, let's spend time with good characters and they can be found in the church in the form of God-fearing men and women. Try to influence those of bad company to do right but be very careful as you do it. Bad company corrupts good character.
