#### Heritage from the Lord

<sup>3</sup> Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb a reward.
<sup>4</sup> Like arrows in the hand of a warrior are the children of one's youth.
<sup>5</sup> Blessed is the man who fills his quiver with them!

Psalm 127:3-5

The second perspective for us to consider about children being compared to the arrows in the hand of a warrior in Psalm 127 is their need for direction. A warrior with an arrow would only be as good as his aim. To strike the bullseye of a target takes great focus. A warrior must find the target, block out distractions, focus on the bullseye, and let the arrow fly. To successfully raise a child to do God's will take these steps as well. Well, how can it be done?

Parents must take careful aim with their children if they are to successfully raise them into a faithful relationship with God. The first step involves asking "What is your spiritual goal for your child?" This seems rather simple, but it is a very important part of raising a child. Where do you want them to be spiritually in 5 or 10 years. Without focus on a target the warrior is just shooting into the wind. Secondly, you must then assess what is most important in my child's life, and block out possible distractions. There are so many things that a child can do during their early years, a parent must use great discretion to decide what will help them reach their goal and what is a distraction to this task. Once your goal is clear you must keep your eye on the target. Life is busy, schedules are hectic and it is easy to take your eyes off the prize. We only have them for a little while so make sure to focus intently in the few years you have them. Finally, as parents we must let them fly. As bad as we may want them to, our children are not meant to stay at home and remain under our wing. They are mean to go out into the world, and be a faithful disciple of Christ. Raise them with this in mind. They must develop their own faith, start to create their own spiritual goals, and have a relationship with God that is independent of their parents. Arrows are not meant to stay in the quiver of the warrior. They are meant to go out and make a difference. May God bless us with the way we use the gift of children. See you Sunday! John

Matthew 16:18 And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church,, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it.
