NO!

Psalm 127 tells us "Children are a heritage from the Lord", and it implies a parent's need to give them direction in life. I would like to spend the next few weeks giving some advice to our parents of young children. My first piece of advice to parents today is to Say No! Most young parents I see today make the mistake of not saying no, but I am not talking about saying no to your children. I mean say no to the world's attempt to claim all of your time. I want you to know it is ok to say no to sports, no to constant recreation, no to spending more money on things your children will not be interested in in a few months. It is ok to have a simple birthday party, a nice Staycation (vacation at home), or a nice night at home with no activities other than time with family. Its ok to threaten your child's profession career prospects (and help improve their overall health) by a mandatory 2 months a year break from structured physical sporting activities. It is ok to sav no.

The problem is it is easy to think "Everyone else is doing it!" I remember the same pressure with our boys, and I will tell you what help me to see the power of no. I looked around at the families that were saying yes to everything and saw way too many of those families falling apart. I saw parents who were too invested in children and not vested enough in their marriage. I saw exhausted parents who thought this is just what it is like if you have kids. I saw way too many kids caught up in a rat race they didn't really enjoy. I saw students make it to high school tired of a crazy schedule, and decided to quit the activities that had dominated their life because they did not enjoy these activities anymore.

The danger I saw was replacing purpose with busyness. We believe that if our kids are busy doing things then it will make them successful or help their self esteem. This is rarely true. The children I have seen with the healthiest self esteem are those who know they are loved, their family has time for each other, and they have real purpose in what they do. You cannot avoid the crazy busyness of having children, but parents must manage it. Take time off. Schedule a season just for the family. Save your money. Have a meal at home. Take an evening walk, or a trip to a park. Use your Saturday to spend time together and find rest to prepare for Sunday. Create times for family talks, passing on values with your activities, and talk about what God has done for you. It is amazing what you are able to say yes to when you find the power to say no.
