Lawsuits Among Believers

I Corinthians 6:7 The very fact that you have lawsuits among you means you have been completely defeated already. Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be cheated?

An often ignored Biblical subject is found in I Corinthians 6 in verses one through eight. Apparently at this congregation individuals had disputes with each other so severe that lawsuits were taken before the governing authorities. Paul is very displeased with this behavior. First, Christians should be able to resolve differences with one another and second, it looks very bad to have Christians arguing publicly with each other before the court system. Paul counsels for disputes to be settled in the local congregation. Sadly down through the years this instruction has not been followed. This has lead to the church not looking so good. Paul was greatly concerned about the influence that individuals had on the church. Are we doing anything to make the church look bad? If so, then it needs to be stopped immediately.

Why were lawsuits happening in the church? A dispute occurs when two people disagree and are unwilling to budge. Two individuals have to have their way. Jesus Christ set the example for putting himself last and others first. Paul tells the participants in the lawsuit to let it go. This is so contrary to today's thinking. The brothers were told to work it out in the local congregation and if in the end you feel cheated or wronged to accept it. This is far better than the church's influence being harmed. I suspect if the two Christians involved had the attitude of Christ then the trouble in Corinth would have never occurred. Are we following the teaching within Scriptures?
