Do you Remember

Revelation 2:5 Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place—unless you repent.

Today marks the 17th anniversary of the attacks of 9/11. For those of us who lived through this day, the memories are burned into our mind. Jesus' Power Over Nature

Matthew 8:27 The men were amazed and asked, "What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey him!"

One of the evidences to show that Jesus was the Son of God was his ability to control nature. In Matthew 8, we are introduced to a storm that is described as furious and creating waves that were going over and into the boat. The disciples were fearful for their lives. They shouted to the Lord to save them for they thought they were about to drown. Jesus simply spoke to the wind and the waves and the men saw the sea immediately grow calm. Never had they seen anything like this. No human could do such a thing, but the Son of God could and did.

This was not the only time that Jesus displayed this power. Many other examples are found in the gospels that demonstrate this power. One on occasion Jesus walked on the water. What other man could do such a thing? None, but he did command Peter to come to him and he did. Another time Jesus spoke to a fig tree that was not productive and the disciples found it withered up the next day. Jesus caused fish to gather so that nets were breaking due to the large catch. He also caused one fish to pick up a coin and to be caught on a line. Jesus also displayed his power over nature by feeding crowds. Two times Jesus fed large crowds with very little food. The food to feed a single person fed thousands with food left over. When reading this, we should be just as amazed as the disciples were. This will tell us with no doubts whatsoever that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. Just as the Hebrew writer stated, he "sustained all things by his powerful word."
