It's been a long time between messages, but I'm glad to be back on the newsletter horse again.

In the absence of a written report during last year I'm going to give a brief overview of the highlights of 2019 before I get into the happenings of the last three months.

2019 IN BRIEF

Jan. Our family camp: Theme: *Hall of Faith* (Heb.11).

Feb. Campaign: Doors knocked 2909; Conversations 1181; Bible studies set 26 (19 during campaign, 6 during follow-up); People to call back on 51.



I wish I could say there were several converts as a result, but alas this wasn't the case. With so many excellent prospects I genuinely thought we'd see at least a couple of new Christians, yet not one obeyed the gospel.

In these situations it's tempting to doubt yourself, question your study tools, or get all suspicious over what some might be saying about the church. However, while an honest assessment may suggest a need for improvement, and even if there is some validity to the thought that warnings about "those church of Christ people" are being circulated; ultimately individuals are responsible to choose for themselves whether to accept or reject the truth (Acts 2:40-41; 13:44, 46; 14:1-4; Rom.6:16-17; cf. Jsh.24:15) - despite how unpolished the presentation may appear to be (cf. 1Cor.2:1-3) - and the church has been spoken against from its beginning (Acts 13:45; 14:2; 19:9; 28:22); so if it's happening to us it's probably a sign we're doing something right, (cf. 2Tim.3:12).

Mar. Chloe's 18th b'day. Cash Collins is born.



Apr. I spoke at the New Plymouth Camp/ L'ship: Theme: *Answering the Tough Questions*. I addressed "How can you believe in miracles and all that nonsense?" & "Why can't women lead in the church?"

By the way, I certainly recommend you study the gospel with your children before they take this step, even if they have "heard it all before" in sermons & classes etc. It is a good way to determine if they have a mature understanding of spiritual concepts, and perhaps more importantly, they are seeing it in the Scriptures for themselves, rather than being told what to believe. There are many good teaching tools available for this purpose, and I'm more than happy to share with you what I use; just ask.




The congregation was very excited at the baptism of these two.





GENERAL

TEACHING / WORSHIP
