The church does not need this divisiveness. It was a poor example that was being provided by these two ladies.

Were these evil women? No, these women have worked alongside of Paul in the cause of the gospel. They loved the Lord and they wanted to see the church at Philippi grow. Some issue caused them to take a stand that they would not back down from. Selfish ambition was destroying their relationship and harming the church. If each would think more of the other, then this argument would disappear. This is exactly what was discussed previously in the second chapter. When Paul talked to the Corinthians about lawsuits, he condemned this attitude of having to have my way. He asked if it was not better to be wronged in our own eyes than to have this battle going on in the church. The church needed its peace restored and brotherly love needed to be prevalent once again. There was too much work to do for it to be destroyed by an argument.
