No Other Gods Before Me

Exodus 20:3 You shall have no other gods before me.

An October 2017 survey was conducted in Britain about the relevance of the Ten Commandments. Our society often mimics their results either concurrently or within a very short time. The result shows that God is out in today's society. How many agree with "you shall not kill"? How many agree with "you shall not steal"? Both questions have 93% agreement. Eighty-seven percent agreed that bearing false witness was wrong while 73% agreed adultery was wrong. A high percentage also believed in honoring your father and mother. What about the first four of the Ten Commandments? These are the ones about man's relationship with God. Only 20% agreed that we should have no other gods before God. Only 23% thought you had to be careful in the way you use God's name. Thirty-one percent believed it was wrong to worship idols. Sadly, God is being removed from people's lives.

What makes murder, stealing or adultery wrong? These are commands that came from God and yet people are ignoring him to a large extent today. God taught us how we should relate to our fellowman as well as to him. How strange that we would ignore the giver of the law and the one who has given us life. The survey was also broken down into Christian and non-religious categories. Only 46% of Christians said idolatry was wrong. Only 36% of Christians agreed with the verse of today. God is being removed! Will we strive to give him his place of honor? Will we stand on his side? Will we proclaim the Biblical evidence of his power and might and authority? Let's do all we can to turn people back to the true and living God who has given us opportunity for salvation.
