#### **Psalm 133:1** Behold, how good and how pleasant it is For brothers to dwell together in unity!

#### **Troubles Of My Heart**

## **Psalm 25:16** *Turn to me and be gracious to me, for I am lonely and afflicted.*

This Psalm was written by David when he was facing circumstances in his life that were not favorable. Two things are specifically mentioned in this verse. He was a lonely man. If this was during his time of fleeing from Saul then often he was alone. On occasions his men were unhappy with him as well as Saul's entire army. Later upon becoming king, he found it lonely at the top. Loneliness is rampant today. How do you handle your loneliness? Second, he said he was afflicted. This was probably some form of illness. Illness can bring about isolation or simply being unable to perform your everyday tasks greatly affects every aspect of life. How do you handle afflictions? In the following verse, David also stated that "the troubles of my heart have multiplied". What do you do when everything seems to be going wrong?

David called upon the Lord. He wanted God to turn to him to show him his grace. God had not deserted him but that it is how it felt. David wanted to be free from his anguish, protected from his enemies and rescued from his predicaments. Two more things he requested. First, he asked that God take away his sins and second that God remember his integrity and uprightness. As we face troubles we would be wise to practice these two thoughts as well. There is no indication that David's troubles were associated with sin but nonetheless he wanted to be forgiven of any sin. We should also focus on how we have tried to live a faithful life of obedience to the laws of God. David concludes this song with the expression of hope. If we will put our faith in God we will come from our troubles with hope as well.
