The past few days have been exciting for us here at Eastside. We have now officially closed on our building loan, permits have been approved and as of Tuesday, dirt is being moved. This project is finally underway. Of course it will take several more months to complete. In the end this new building will better enable us to reach others and do more for the cause of Christ. Our present location has served us well for many years but unfortunately the growth of the city and especially the redirecting of HWY 50 has left us cut off from most of the city. It is astonishing how many people have no idea where our building is because we are tucked away in a neighborhood. Having a building on one of the most traveled roads in town will solve this problem. For all of the excitement and opportunities this building will bring, we must remember in the end it is just a building. Sure it will be a great facility to meet in. However, the real success for Christ will come from the efforts of each of the members who attend there.

I am fully aware there have been and still are some disgruntled feelings about the building project and several misunderstandings. I also know some will not make the move with us and have even said they will go elsewhere. One the other hand the overwhelming majority of members support this project. With that said, we all need to ask ourselves, what can I do? First, support the project through daily prayer. Ask God to help this project along and for the sale of this building. Pray for the elders as they plan and make decisions about it. Pray for the safety of the workers. Pray for you to have a greater role whatever it may be. **Second**, support it through encouragement. Tell the elders you support the decisions they have made. Let others know your enthusiasm about it and speak positively about it. Third, support if by showing up and being involved. A 20 million dollar building would look nice but if few showed up to worship there what good would it be? Your presence alone shows some level of support. Fourth, support it by inviting friends and family to come be a part of what Eastside has to offer. Regardless of where we are located everyone should do this. God never said you are personally responsible for teaching and baptizing people. But we must give as many people as possible the opportunity to hear the gospel. Finally, support it through giving. No, this is not an attempt to make anyone feel guilty. God does not want your money if guilt is attached. The reality is the Lord's work takes money. I am fully aware these are "tough times" for a lot of people. Yet, I am convinced, everyone can give something, \$50.00, \$100.00, \$500.00 etc. . . Maybe you cannot afford a lump sum but what about small weekly or monthly increases in your giving? If everyone gave only \$10 more per week our contribution would well surpass our budget. We should all be thankful our elders have prayerfully considered a "plan" for what to do with God's money. How will you support this work and every work at Eastside?
