Do not speak against one another (Jm. 4:11).

Do not complain against one another (Jm. 5:9).

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 101

101:7 No one who practices deceit will dwell in my house; no one who speaks falsely will stand in my presence.

This Psalm was written from the perspective of the king of Israel. Most believe David to be the author and many believe it was written for the day of the inauguration of his son Solomon. The king is making a pledge before God and to his people to reign righteously. He began by declaring that "I will be careful to lead a blameless life". What an important statement! Christian, are we careful to lead a blameless life? People see what we do and we are an influence whether we desire to be or not. Do they see us as a person striving to live the Christian life?

The writer states than in his house – his home – he will walk with a blameless heart and he will set no vile thing before his eyes. Those in our home know more about us than anyone else. We cannot fool them for long. Our language, what we look at, our actions and all that we do will betray us if we are not seeking the blameless life. Our spouse, our children, our parents and any other members of our home know whether we are two faced or not.

The king also promised to surround himself with good people. If men are wicked, faithless or evil he will have nothing to do with them. We need to surround ourselves with godly people. When someone is trying to encourage us towards evil, we must send them away or leave ourselves. The king assured his people that liars and those that practice deceit would not be found in his presence. Rather he would have the blameless to minister to him. This seems to be seldom found in our government today. Brothers and sisters, do we surround ourselves with those of high moral character? If we would take the stand this writer does we would find the world a better place.
