How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

Don't you just hate it when you have a bad day? Let's be honest, no one wants to have nor enjoys having a bad day. Whether it is a sudden illness, accident, death, burnt toast, missed alarm clock, rude comment, etc. . . . things happen that ruin our day sometimes. After a good brother experienced one such day recently, he remarked, "If this day were a fish, I would have thrown it back." No matter how great it would be to push rewind or throw it back and try again, it is never possible. So what are we to do when our days are ruined? In 1 Peter, Peter is writing to a group of Christians (the church in general) who were scattered abroad (vs. 2). The reason for this was persecution from the Roman Empire. In essence there were many Christians who were facing and had been facing many bad days. Peter fills this first chapter with reasons to be happy despite the circumstances of any bad day. Consider the following seven reasons to be happy no matter what happens. As a Christians you can find happiness because. . . .

- 1. You are one of Gods elect (1 Pt. 1:2). By obeying the gospel we become God's special and chosen people. We are the objects of His special love as His children (Ps. 37:25).
- 2. You are sanctified (1 Pt. 1:2). This simply reminds us we are set apart for a specific purpose. Serving God is our special purpose in this world (Mt. 5:16-17).
- 3. You are sprinkled by the blood of Christ (vs. 2). Using some O.T. imagery of the work of the High Priests sprinkling the sacrificial blood on the altar as a means of forgiveness, Peter is saying we too have had the blood of Christ applied to our lives in a similar way.
- 4. You have a living hope (vs. 3). Hope is the idea of expecting something better. Through Jesus' resurrection, we expect something better than anything this life has to offer.
- 5. You have an inheritance (vs.4). Notice the four things said about it. It is imperishable, undefiled, will not fade away, reserved in Heaven.
- 6. You are kept by the power of God (vs. 5). God will protect, provide and keep you in ways you do not always understand or know about (Rm. 8:28)
- 7. Your salvation is ready to be revealed (vs. 9). Salvation is reality. Eternity in God's presence is waiting for us.

Life is not always easy and days do get ruined. But when we stop and look at the big picture, the truth is as long as we remain faithful to God, our happiness guaranteed no matter what happens.

108:4 For great is your love, higher than the heavens; your faithfulness reaches to the skies.

The Psalm is divided into two major divisions. In the first five verses, David sings of God's great love and faithfulness. Verses six through the end of the song asked for God's help when David went up against the enemies of Israel. Some of the readers have been in a battle situation. I very much appreciate the sacrifice made by the American soldier for our country. I am thankful that I have not seen firsthand the horrors of war. I cannot imagine the bullets flying, the bombs exploding, the maimed and dead bodies of men, women and children.
