## **Summits of the Psalms**

112:1 Blessed is the man who fears the Lord, who finds great delight in his commands.

Meditate upon them and see the love that God has displayed for his people. The Psalmist offers many blessings to consider.

The first blessing mentioned is through the family. The godly man will teach his children godly principles and they will grow to be mighty in the land. As they follow in their father's footsteps they will be blessed. Second, when a man is righteous, wealth and riches are in his house. Riches are not always a sign of righteousness but God does provide for his people. Third, light will shine even in darkness for the upright man. Fourth, the righteous man is generous and God sees to it that good will come his way. Scriptures promise blessings in return for generosity and God is faithful to his word.
