How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

An old story tells of a father and his young son walking along a path in the woods. Along the way the father noticed there was a lot of poison ivy on the side of the path. Seeing the obvious danger, the father warned his son to stay on the path. Soon the little boy was wondering on the side. The father grabbed him and told him again, stay on the path. But a few minutes later, he was on the side again and the father was correcting him once more. Finally after the boy wandered onto the side again the father stepped in and spanked the boy for not doing what he said. Then through the tears, the little boy asked, "What's a path?"

The father in this story quickly realized it was his fault for not making it clear to his son and making sure he understood what he was told. He simply assumed the boy knew what he was talking about and knew what the right thing to do was.

I think too often we end up being like this father. We look around us at the evils of the world and sin people openly engage in and wonder why and how they could do those things. We shake our heads in disgust and rightly so. People know universally certain things are wrong (i.e. murder) but what about the sinful lives that typically lead up to such crimes? The higher moral living (righteousness) that God calls us to is not something we just know on our own. Someone has to teach us either by word, example or both. This does not necessarily excuse people from their behavior but it does highlight the importance of righteous living in the daily lives of Christians. People are watching how you live, whether at home work or public. Most importantly God is watching (Ps. 34:15). How you act and live will determine what many people (right or wrong) will think about you and the Christ you represent. You have the opportunity to influence many people for good and teach them by your example (and words when you have the opportunity) about living righteously. For some people you may be the only Bible they ever read, the closest they ever come into contact Christ.

When you see people veering off the path, do not just assume they even know what the path is. Do not be hateful and condemning when talking to people and most of all do not look down your nose at them either. Instead, live the way you know God wants you to live. By doing so you will show people what the path really is (Mt. 5:16).

Summits of the Psalms

By: Joe Macer Psalm 114

114:3 The sea looked and fled, the Jordan turned back;

This Psalm was also sung before the families of Israel began to eat the Passover feast. The words are a reminder of God's deliverance of his people from Egypt. The Jews found themselves in a foreign nation among people with a different language. They grew to a point that they were a nation of people within a nation. Pharaoh made life miserable for the Israelites and they cried out to God for help. God responded in a powerful way. First he declared that his people would be his sanctuary. He would live among them and they would be his people. Second, he delivered them from the power of the Egyptians.

The writer used very poetic language to describe the miraculous departure from Egypt. He wrote the sea fled, the mountains skipped and the rock was turned into a pool. Nature was changed by the power of God when Israel left Egypt. The sea was split and the Israelites walked across on dry ground. The sea closed in on the Egyptian army and it was destroyed. The great and powerful nation of Egypt was brought low and the lowly nation of Israel was exalted.

To the family gathered around the meal the message was "Tremble, O earth, at the presence of the Lord, at the presence of the God of Jacob." Do not ever forget his power, his saving deliverance and his love for his mistreated people. Give him all the respect and honor due his name. Israel existed because God chose to act through them. May we never forget his divine power and loving kindness still shown to his people down to this very day.
