Summits of the Psalms

120:2 Save me, O Lord, from lying lips and from deceitful tongues.

Psalms 120-134 are known as songs of ascents. As the Jewish people made their way to Jerusalem on their annual pilgrimage, they sang these songs. The journey to Jerusalem was up hill and thus the reason for the word ascents. A great amount of joy was shared by all as they made this trip to Jerusalem to worship God.

The Psalmist had live in a foreign land. He had been around the people of Meshech and Kedar. They were barbarians. They did not want peace but instead had a love for war. These were not people trained by the word of God. They were people who had lying lips and deceitful tongues. They could not be trusted. When having a discussion they could not be believed. In talking with men back from some of the recent wars they described people who said all the right things to their face and then went and did the exact opposite. This type of behavior is ingrained in some cultures. O how the Psalmist must have enjoyed being in a group of God's people going to worship! God's people must not have lying lips nor should they have deceitful tongues. God's people must be honest with their tongue. What a pleasure to be among such people.

One of my great thoughts about heaven is being among people when there is no longer any sin. In heaven, everything spoken will be true. All liars will not have a part in heaven. No one in heaven will be trying to deceive or take advantage of another. We will also being in the presence of the God of the universe who cannot lie. What a wonderful place it will be!
