

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 121

121:1 I lift up my eyes to the hills – where does my help come from?

This Psalm of ascents reminds us that God is our help. As the pilgrims journeyed to Jerusalem they had many concerns about their journey. The road was rough and rocky. Twisting an ankle, breaking a bone or being hurt was a real possibility. The heat of the day and the cold of the night could present problems. Criminals hid behind rocks and often attacked or robbed the pilgrims. Their great desire was to make it to Jerusalem for worship. They wanted a smooth journey just as you and I would today as we are traveling. Their sight was set on reaching the top of the mountain - Mt Zion also known as Jerusalem. This Psalm is about God leading the way until they complete the journey and come to the house of the Lord.

Where will the help come from? It will come from God who is ever so powerful. He is the Creator. He is the Maker of heaven and earth. Since he can speak mountains into existence, then he is able to guide the steps of those on a journey to worship him. He will not let the foot slip. Because he is God and not a man he does not need sleep. No matter what time they journey – whether day or night, God will be watching over them. He will be their shade - protection from the elements as well as from men. God will keep from harm and lead to the conclusion of the journey.
