Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 129

129:3 Plowmen have plowed my back and made their furrows long.

Think of the imagery of the plow presented by the Psalmist. What may begin as smooth level ground with grass growing on it is turned upside down. The soil is no longer smooth and the grass is buried leaving it to suffocate and die. This Psalm is about Israel and how she was plowed by the Babylonians. Historically, nation after nation had attacked Israel and taken advantage of the Jews. Their land was taken; their religious items destroyed; their homes were plundered as well as all their livestock and possessions. They were an oppressed people and yet the writer declared that, "they have not gained the victory over me."

Eventually Israel made it home from the Babylonian captivity. When this occurred, the Psalmist asked God to bring shame on those who hate Zion. His prayer is that they fade away just as grass without water would. There would be no reason to ask for God's blessings because Israel's enemies would be destroyed.

This Psalm is a good reminder that the church will be persecuted as well. Jesus clearly stated this when talking to his disciples. Persecution will come but the church will not be destroyed. Often persecution will actually strengthen the church. Satan and those who do his bidding may treat us like dirt. They may turn our world upside down but we will not be destroyed. May we say along with the writer that, "the Lord is righteous." Trust him and he will make all things right in due time.
