On the night of March 13, 1964, a young woman named Kitty Genovese died at the hands of a brutal killer. Winston Moseley stabbed her a dozen times and then stole a measly \$49. What caught the attention of the nation was not another killing in New York. It was that it happened within earshot of about thirty people. They all heard the screams but did absolutely nothing.

For many it was evidence of a moral whirlpool sucking America into both inaction and lack of caring. After all, why would anyone just sit in their home and listen to the dying screams of a woman and not even call the police? The truth was Genovese was as much the victim of the "bystander syndrome" as the knife of Moseley. Further studies showed one simple fact: If one person hears the screams they are likely to take action, since they are the only ones who can do anything. But in a crowd, everyone says, "Surely someone will call the police." When someone else is made responsible, no one is responsible.

How will eternity judge the "bystander syndrome?" The lost surround those with a message and will go an entire lifetime without ever hearing even a little of it. Is it that we do not care? It is likely that so few ever lift a finger to attempt to evangelize someone else (through simple encouragement, inviting them to church, a caring conversation, etc. . .) because we believe "someone else will do it." There are plenty of churches, preachers and fanatics, so why should I do it? God has actually put each of us in the orbit of friends and relatives because we are the "someone." They may or may not ever meet someone else, but they know you. When we fail to even try a little (I do not mean shove the Bible down their throats) it sometimes reflects the fact, the Lord really does not mean that much to me anyway.

Kitty died amidst a caring neighborhood that assumed someone would stop the killing. How many people do you know right now that will perish because "someone " will reach them with the gospel? There is always work to do in the Lord's Kingdom, never assume it is up to "someone else" or that "someone else" is doing it. We all have a part and an important role. Will you be "someone?"

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 126

126:5 Those who sow in tears will reap with songs of joy.
