Last week many across our nation were saddened to learn about the loss of the beloved T.V. icon Andy Griffith. Although he was 86 years old and in failing health, some people said they felt Andy would just live on forever. "The Andy Griffith Show" originally ran from 1960-68 with a direct spin off called "Mayberry R.F.D." lasting three more years and still very popular until its cancelation. Although Mayberry never really existed nor did any of its residence, it spoke and still speaks to us in a special way a lot of people can still identify with. I believe we can all learn some lasting lessons from Mayberry.

First, we learn the value of being and having a good neighbor. This town was full of good people who made good neighbors. Everyone knew everyone else. There was a strong sense of community and fellowship among them. They looked out for each other and cared for one another. These same principles are described by Jesus in the parable of the Good Samaritan (Lk. 10:25-37).

Second, we learn the importance of lasting friendship. Not only were there many good neighbors but there were also many good friends. Andy, Barney, Goober and Aunt Bee all had lasting friendships along with many other townsfolk. These people knew firsthand the importance of being there for each other through thick and thin. True to God's word again, "A friend loves at all times" (Prv. 17:17).

Third, even though the Sheriff never carried a gun unless he had to and the deputy had only one bullet in his shirt pocket, people still needed law and order. There were never any major crime waves in Mayberry. Occasionally a criminal would pass through town but in the end they were better than they were before they came because they had passed through Mayberry. Overall these people had a respect for law and order and what was right.

Fourth, one day we will all pass from this life just like the people of Mayberry. "It is appointed unto man once to die, after this comes the judgment" (Hb. 9:27). In a real sense Andy and Mayberry will never go away they will live on in reruns in the hearts of their fans that is what they leave behind. The same holds true for each of us, what we leave behind will have an impact upon the lives of many people years after we are gone. How much more important is it that we leave behind a strong legacy of good values, morals, faith and love?

## **Summits of the Psalms**

By: Joe Macer Psalm 130

130:3 If you, O Lord, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand?

O, the terrible price of sin. Four concepts are presented is this short Psalm to get across to us the great need of forgiveness that we desire from God. The first two verses picture a man in the ocean about to drown. He cannot save himself. He does the have the power, strength or ability to do it. His only hope is found in God and he cried out for God mercy. Our sins make us like the drowning man.

The next two verses take us to the courtroom. The verdict is in and we are guilty. There is a record of our sins. We cannot stand before the judge since even one sin makes us guilty. The great news is that our judge can forgive sins. We can cry out to him. This powerful judge is to be feared since our lives are in his hand.

The third pair of verses is about watchmen. Watchmen do their work at night. It is difficult and lonely. The watchmen pray for the light of morning. They hope that an attack does not come on their shift. Sin puts us into darkness and our only hope of seeing the light once again is by placing our hope in God. We wait for him and we spend time in his word but God is the one to bring us from the darkness of sin into his light.

The final pair of verses is about redemption. In the writer's day, there was a slave market. One was not in control of his destiny. It depended upon your owner. The owner could set you free. He could pay your redemption price. We cannot come up with the price but God will redeem us from our sins. This Psalm should be so meaningful to us today when we realize that Jesus Christ came to save us, to forgive us, to bring us into the light and to redeem us from all of our sins.
