Reflecting on a Tragedy

Sunday morning in our young adult Bible class we asked the question "What is the Christian response to a tragedy like last week's shooting in Colorado?" While many discussions have arisen about this tragedy, its causes, and society's proper response three reflections come to mind.

1. Life is short. We live in a country of comfort and relative safety and because of this we can be fooled into thinking this world is our home. It is not our home, and it is not meant to be. Through all eternity will marvel at the brevity of our life on earth because it is "but a vapor". We only have today! Let's make it count!

2. The real problem in this world is sin. Mike Huckabee has been criticized for part of his response to this event on Fox news when he said "We don't have a crime problem, a gun problem or even a violence problem. What we have is a sin problem....". While the world, or any of us for that matter, never wants to hear that sin is our biggest problem, it is true. The biggest tragedy is that everyday thousands of people enter eternity unaware of this fact and unprepared to meet their maker. We live in a broken world, full of broken people, following broken lies, living broken lives, because they don't know the One that can make them whole. God does not want us to avoid sin because He needs more good people around Him. He tells us to avoid sin because this protects us. When we sin, we hurt ourselves and those around us. God wants us to be blessed in this life and He knows it is impossible to be truly blessed in this life while walking in sin. While sickness, death, pain, grief, hardship, depression will continue in this broken world, a Christian knows these are passing away for those who have found the One who died for their sins.

3. God is the Answer. I believe God is so sad at the fact that despite all His efforts man still wants to follow his own plan. God knows that His plan for man would lead to all of us living in harmony. God's plan acted out in the life of every man and woman on earth would surround those with mental illness with loving support. God's plan acted out in everyone's lives would mean love for others was always present. Families would be a place of support and encouragement where young people would be trained how to live. People would be there for others when they are down, and everyone would know that life is a special gift from God. This life is the time when we have a chance to prepare for eternal life with Him. The problem is that we live in a world full of people that don't know or understand God's purpose for their lives. They live in darkness and even though God sent the light into the world the world has "loved darkness rather than light". That is why as Christians we must first dedicate our lives to follow God's plan in order to reflect His light in our lives, and do the best we can to bring others into that light. This refection is the greatest response a Christian can have to this tragedy.

Summits of the Psalms

Psalm 132

132:13 For the Lord has chosen Zion, he has desired it for his dwelling.

One of David's greatest desires was to build a permanent location to worship God. David was not given the opportunity to build the temple but he did a tremendous amount of preparation for the building. His son, Solomon, actually put his father's plans into action and completed the project.

David made a vow that he would find a place for the Lord. This was to be a place of worship. He envisioned having the Ark of the Covenant located here as well. Once the building was completed the ark was housed within it. David expected it to be a place of great joy and he expected the priests who served there to be clothed in righteousness. God chose the location of Zion (Jerusalem) for the building of the temple. This also was the location of the palace in which David resided.

God was pleased with these thoughts and efforts by David and made some promises to him as well. The Lord swore that one of David's descendants would be on his throne as long as they followed his statutes. Secondly, he promised that it would be his resting place forever and ever. Third, he promised abundant provisions for the people. Fourth, he promised a horn which is a reference to the coming Messiah. Lastly, he promised to clothe David's enemies with shame. This Psalm shows how much that God wants to bless those that keep his covenant and his statutes and desire to worship him. May we follow the example that David – the man after God's own heart – left for us
