Through the years, I have learned, I am often times too trusting or more correctly too believing of people. I have never trusted the wrong person in the sense of being taken advantage of by them or being harmed in some way, but I have believed people who were obviously lying to me and others about themselves. I recall one supervisor I used to work for (yes, that's right I once had a real job or two!). He was in his early forties and he and I became good friends. He would often tell stories about things that had happened in his life and I would believe him because he was my friend and had no reason to lie to me or anyone else for that matter especially about the things we often talked about. But looking back after gaining a few more years of valuable "life experience" I now realize this guy was a big liar.

Often times people will lie about their faithfulness to God and their love for the Lord. I know this sounds shocking, but they will do so without even realizing it or meaning to intentionally lie. When asked if they are a Christian or if they are faithful etc. the answer will readily be a yes. However, truth is no.

In writing against a lot of dangerous problems creeping their way into the church, John repeatedly warns and reminds us who the faithful really are. He writes, "By this we know that we have come to know Him, if we keep His commandments. The one who says, "I have come to know Him," and does not keep His commandments, is a **liar**, and the **truth** is not in him; but whoever keeps His word, in him the love of God has truly been perfected. By this we know that we are in Him: the one who says he abides in Him ought himself to walk in the same manner as He walked (1 Jn. 2:3-6). Notice what John is saying, walking is synonymous with how we consistently live our lives (not just what we do on Sundays). If "we say" that we know the Lord (i.e., love Him, live faithfully, are a Christian, etc. . .) and are not actually consistently living that way, then God says you're lying. Also there is an expectation to walk/ live according to the way God wants you to live.

You see, we may fool people in this life with what we say, but we never will fool God. We have all known people who talk it up about how much they love God and how religious they are, yet their lives say otherwise. Always remember, Christianity is more about the walk and less about the talk. Are you a liar? Brian

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 137

137:4 How can we sing the songs of the Lord while in a foreign land?

This Psalm was written by an individual who was taken from his home - Israel - to the land of the Babylonians. He had seen his nation conquered and destroyed. Now living in Babylon he weeps over the former life that has been lost. He weeps over loss of the temple and his religious practices of home. He had not forgotten the blessing of home and of worship.

While in Babylon, the captors asked the Jews to play for them songs from home. They wanted to hear joyful songs - songs about Zion and songs about the God of the Jews. The captives were in no mood to sing songs of joy. It was hurtful to even think of singing songs of praise while mockers of their religion and their God stood nearby hoping for pleasure at their expense. The songs would remain in their hearts and they prayed that their hands would not forget the skill of playing these songs. They hoped and expected to play them again in the future.

The Psalmist prayed that God would not forget what had been done to them. They tore the city and the temple down to its foundations. Many Jews lost their lives, including women and children. The writer asked God and believed that God would in the future do the same to Babylon. War is such an ugly experience and he wanted Babylon to experience exactly what the Jews had previously. He looked forward to returning home and praising God. Dear Christian, do not take for granted the wonderful privilege of worshipping God. Assemble every opportunity that you have and pray that we will never see what this Jewish man saw.
