How I See It By: Brian Gregory

In Mark 12 after a long discourse answering the challenges to His authority raised at the end of chapter 11, Jesus has silenced all of His opponents and is still in the temple area. Out of all He says and explains about His unique authority Mark records Jesus' statements about an event He witnessed while in the temple. This is a familiar story of the poor widow who gave two mites (probably the modern equivalent of about 2-3 dollars). In the midst of seeing lots of people give their money to the treasury, this insignificant woman (a nobody) drops into the coffers an equally insignificant amount. Although no one else noticed this woman, Jesus did and was very excited about it and said she actually gave more than others. Unless Jesus is doing some fancy U.S. Government style accounting, then there has to be some reason other than monetary value in His response.

First Jesus knew how she gave, out of her poverty, with the right attitude. She did not care about what others were doing or were able to do. She gave from the heart. She gave all she could and then some. She had a lot of faith in her giving. She gave with a trusting heart and let God take care of the rest. How often do we give like that? Second, Jesus knew what she gave, ALL she had to live on and ALL she could give. She could not have given anything more than she did monetarily. Where would more money come from? When would she get more and how? She did not know for certain the answers to any of this, instead she trusted God to provide. Third, Jesus knew how others gave, out of abundance with a lot to give. It was not the giving itself, but the fact they were giving out of obligation and abundance compared to the widow.

Jesus singled her out, that is, God took notice. This is what God is attracted to, the humble of heart (Isa. 57:15). So how do you give? Is it just a few dollars when you could give far more? Is it not at all because you disagree with the eldership? It is not always about the amount. The attitude and heart with which I give is ultimately more important. If this is right, I will give as much as I should be giving. We can give more than just money, by giving ourselves in service to others. I was recently so impressed when I saw this very attitude in action from one of our own widows. While visiting her she gave me her contribution from the past few weeks because she had missed church and saved it waiting for the chance to give it later. She even said she saves a "few dollars" each week to triple her 5th Sunday contribution. I smiled at such faith and I am sure God does too when other people "get it" like she does. We must never think the work of the church is someone else's job. God expects far more from us than to simply show up on Sundays. Find ways to give and give more.

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 141

141:4 Let not my heart be drawn to what is evil, to take part in wicked deeds with all men who are evildoers: let me not eat their delicacies.

In the last Psalm, we found the writer asking God to help him overcome the evil men trying to harm him. In this Psalm, he is still facing wicked and evil men. He openly confesses a fear and a real concern that he had. Sometimes when someone does bad things, shows us hatred, tries to harm us or brings evil, we have a great danger of picking us some of this wickedness and showing retaliation. His prayer in this song is to not participate in the wicked deeds of the evil men. He also asked God to set a guard over his mouth. We are always in danger of picking up the evil around. When David found Saul in the cave it would have been so easy to kill him since Saul was trying to kill David. Instead he left the cave without harming him. He made the right choice.

The Psalmist is aware that sometimes God does rebuke us. He declared that if a righteous man struck him that he would consider it a kindness. If the righteous man rebuked him then he would accept it. He sought protection. He wanted to live. He wanted safety but he also desired to be right with God. More than anything, he prayed that his eyes would be fixed on God and his refuge found in the Lord. No matter what situation we find ourselves in, let's always seek to be found pleasing to God.


