Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 63

63:1 ... my soul thirst for you, my body longs for you, in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

Think of the time in your life that you were the thirstiest. How strongly did you want a drink? What would you have done to get a cup of water? What would you have paid for a cup of water? On that occasion, when were you satisfied? Only after receiving the drink did your body relax. This illustration is used to show us how the Psalmist desired God. Often men only want a little piece of God. Men do not want to be all consumed with God. Men do not want to surrender all. How strong is our desire for God? Is this what we focus on each day? The Psalmist knew God and he wanted God all the more in his life. Once again he was facing troubles. In good times or bad, is our greatest desire in life to have God in our lives? Never forget that God is still there even in our worst of times.

There are some great hints as to why this writer wanted God so much. First, he had seen God within the sanctuary. He knew God and wanted God within his life. Second, he knew how valuable God is to our lives. He stated, "your love is better than life." Which is strongest – our desire to live or our desire to seek God? Third, he knew that only God satisfies. As the belly can be satisfied with the richest of foods, our soul can be satisfied with God in our lives. Fourth, he thought about God. "On my bed I remember you; I think of you through the watches of the night." Is our mind centered on God? When we begin to think and act like this we are in the process of clinging to God. A child will grab hold of his father's leg and not let go. We should do the same with God. How strong is our desire for him? Will you grab hold and never let go?

March Theme: Clothe ourselves in compassion, kindness, humility, and gentleness.

Goal: 31 days of Kindness. Each day do a random act of kindness.
