# How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

It has been said anything worth doing is worth doing right. Anytime someone does not put their heart fully into something it will never be as good as it could and should be. For example, if your heart is not fully in your marriage it will suffer. If your heart is not fully in your work, it will suffer. The Irish writer and poet, Oscar Wilde is quoted as saying, "I am not young enough to know everything, but the Bible assures me that the above description of a life should never be used to describe a Christian." Unfortunately, too often many Christians feel as if they already know everything. While it is true they may never come out and say it or think it very often, their attitudes towards God are reflected in their actions. In short, they are half-hearted Christians.

Long ago the psalmist wrote, "I hate those who are double-minded, but I love your law" (Psa. 119:113). These are not the words of fanatic extremist. However, they are the words of a man who showed his fervent anger (and love for God) against those who waver and are men/ women with divided loyalty. In the end their lip service to God's law is proven useless by a life of disobedience.

We should also know the Lord feels the same way about half-hearted Christians. To the church of Laodicea Jesus said, "I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot; I wish that you were cold or hot. So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth (Rev. 3:15-16). Furthermore, Jesus also said, if salt loses its flavor it is useless and no longer good for anything but to be thrown out (Mt. 5:13). James reminds us a double-minded man is unstable in all his ways (Jm. 1:8). To be half-hearted is the most dangerous position.

God has no place in His Kingdom for half-hearted service. We cannot serve two masters without hating one and loving the other (Mt. 6:24). When people are only dedicated to God for a little over an hour on Sunday morning I must ask, where is their heart the other 167 hours of the week? I know there is more to being a Christian than attending church services, but it does reflect ones level of dedication and commitment. When the saints gather together again for worship (i.e. Sun. night) and you are not present, all though you know you could be, where is your heart? When the opportunities for Bible study (which will increase your knowledge, faith and dedication) are presented (i.e. Sun. morning and Wed. night) and you are not present although you could be, where is your heart? In essence you're saying I do not need to be there because I already know enough. I fear too many Christians are only half-hearted at best. We must ask ourselves, "How does the Lord feel about me?" Would He spit you out of His mouth? Are you guilty of half-hearted Christianity?

# Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 64

64:8 He will turn their own tongues against them and bring them to ruin; all who see them will shake their heads in scorn.

O, the harm that a tongue can do to people. The Psalmist finds himself in trouble and being attacked. Primarily, he is being attacked by what people say and by the plots they are devising. He is being threatened. There is a conspiracy among the evildoers and they are referred to as a noisy crowd. Their tongues are their swords and their words are their arrows. The sword and the arrows were designed to destroy the righteous man. "They encourage each other in evil plans, they talk about hiding their snares." With great arrogance they claim that no one sees and they have the perfect plan that cannot be stopped. Little did they know that God sees and God knows and that God will react. It hurts when people speak against us and plot to destroy us. Words can bring a tremendous amount of pain. What do we do when we are attacked with words?

The Psalmist also used words. He did not retaliate. He did not speak evil in return. He did not utter curses. He prayed to God. He told God that he wanted to voice a complaint. It was a complaint about how people were treating him. He asked God to protect his life from the threat of his enemies. O, how different he was from his attackers. He believed that God would turn the tongues of the evildoers against them. Their ruin would be for all to see. This would bring about a great fear of God when they saw his wonders displayed. The writer then would use his tongue to praise God. How are you using your tongue today? Are you attacking and plotting or are you praying to God and praising his name. With your tongue bring him your every care. He will be listening.
