2011 Theme "Do all in the name of the Lord" Last week the funeral for Marine Lance Cpl. Andrew Carpenter was held at the funeral home close to my house. That afternoon as I headed to pick up my children from school, I noticed several people lining the roadside holding flags. As I passed the funeral home the parking lot was filled beyond capacity with vehicles. I feared being caught in the traffic but was able to make it home in plenty of time. As soon as I arrived I grabbed the only flag we have and took my boys to the end of our neighborhood where we stood with many others proudly, silently waving our flags to pay respect and honor this young man who bravely gave his life defending our nation. This was by far the largest funeral procession I have ever seen with at least 150 vehicles involved. There was a full police escort and the procession was lead by several military veterans on their motorcycles with flags behind them. According to the local paper thousands turned out to line the streets along the 11 mile journey to his final resting place where he was honored with a 21-gun salute and his wife received an American flag.

Although I never knew this man, nor do I know any of his family, it was still very emotional to watch this scene. It was also difficult to explain to my children what happened to him and why. But I was thankful to involve them and be able to teach them a lesson on respect and patriotism. My heart swelled with pride to be able to pay respect to him and his family in a small way. It also made me proud to be an American and proud to be a part of this community with so many turning out to do the same thing.

It is so easy to take things in this life for granted. Hearing about the life of a 27 year old man with a family coming to an abrupt, unexpected end serves as a harsh reminder of the brevity and frailty of life. James fittingly compared our life to that of a vapor which quickly vanishes (Jm. 4:13-14). We always expect to have our health, our life, our possessions and even another day. The truth is nothing is guaranteed and it can all be easily taken away. With these thoughts in mind, let us always have the attitude of thanksgiving in our hearts and be mindful of our blessings each day.



Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 61

61:2 From the ends of the earth I call to you, I call as my heart grows faint; lead me to the rock that is higher than I.

This Psalm is a cry to God and it concluded with a promise to praise God and to fulfill the vows made to God. The author is believed to be David. Some situation was greatly affecting his life. A prayer was offered that as the king of Israel that he would have a longer life. He desired for his throne to remain throughout generations and that he would ever more be in the presence of God. Our heart's desire should be to find ourselves in the presence of God. There is no better place to be found.

The reader is not told what is bothering the author. His heart had grown faint. Everything that could be done had been done and now the only thing was to wait upon God. God was his protector. God is referred to by the Psalmist as my refuge, a strong tower against the foe and as his rock. Lead me to the rock that is higher than I. We sing this phrase often in songs but do we really put it into practice in our lives? There is only so much that we as people can do. We are weak and often we do not begin to accomplish what we wish to do. We are sinful and often chose the wrong path. Do we cry out to the rock that is higher than I? Lead me; guide me; show me the way! God the Creator of this universe has the power to act in our lives. Do we invite him in? David asks for God's protection, his love, his faithfulness and he believed he would see each of them. Let's promise just as David did that we will dwell in God's tent forever.
