This past Sunday was a special time for us here at Eastside. Not only was it Easter Sunday, but we also had our "Youth for Christ" presentations and recognition. Over the past several months (beginning in November) several of our men and women worked with our young people, from ages three and up, on memorizing scripture, quoting the books of the Bible, art projects, mass media, sermon preparation and delivery, public scripture reading, song leading and public prayer. After our morning worship several of our young people were recognized for their memory work. That afternoon we had a ladies worship service where the young ladies were able to lead the ladies in a worship service which included the presentation of lessons they had prepared. That evening with the exception of announcements our entire service was conducted by several of our young men. It was obvious everyone was well prepared.

Programs such as this require a lot of planning and effort from all involved. Each of the adults especially is to be commended and thanked for their participation and work. Without them "Youth for Christ" would have never been possible.

We must never take for granted or overlook the importance of teaching and training our young men and women to be leaders in the church. Several of the young men I witnessed on Sunday night were obviously nervous about making their presentations. However, when they grow up they will be far more willing to take an active role such as song leader, teacher or preacher. It is stated the church could double every generation if we could keep our children faithful. With that said, teaching our children is by far one of the most important things the church can do. It is also our greatest mission work. Young people are bombarded by so many worldly influences and temptations daily, with just a few precious hours a week for Bible class, programs like "Youth for Christ" become even more important in helping ground them in the truth and encouraging them to be actively involved in the church.

The apostle Paul was so impressed when he met a young man named Timothy he took him along with him as a missionary (Acts 16:1-3). Paul would later write of the great faith which dwelt in Timothy. Part of the reason was because someone (his mother and grandmother) had taken the time to teach him the Holy scriptures as a child (2 Tim. 1:5, 3:14-15). With the future of the church at stake we should all do the most we can to support, encourage and teach our young people in such ways (2 Tim. 2:2). It was remarked several times Sunday night, "The future of the church looks good." I could not agree more.
