Much has been said and done as a result of the failed predictions of the end of the world from Harold Camping last week. I think nearly every preacher I know preached something about the second coming of Christ (as did I) last week. This week much is also being said. I have read a few articles about this failed prediction. Most notably Camping himself now claims it was a "Spiritual Judgment" that Jesus has placed upon the world and now no one else can be saved. If that is true then I am out of a job. Listed below are some thoughts from two articles written by gospel preachers. Instead of making fun of Camping, consider the following from Jeff Jenkins. What if he had been right? What if the world had come to an end?

There would be no more chances to tell those I love how much I love them.

There would be no more chances to say I'm sorry to one I might have offended.

There would be no more chances to preach messages that so badly need to be heard.

There would be no more chances for me to make sure my life is right with God.

There would be no more chances for me to spend time with friends and loved ones.

There would be no more chances for me to mend broken relationships.

There would be no more chances for me to repent of sins in my life.

There would be no more chances for me to study the Word of God.

There would be no more chances for me to pray for others.

Second, consider these thoughts from Steve Higginbotham. People can be sincere and still be wrong. Sincerity is not the measure of truth. Remember Saul of Tarsus (Acts 23:1). People can be and are led astray by others. Believing a lie can be costly (1 Kgs. 13:18-24). Presumptuously speaking for God causes others to blaspheme (Rm. 2:24). Saying, "I was wrong," "I don't understand, help me" is hard to say (Jm. 4:10; Acts 8:31). Jesus is coming again. Let God be true and every man a liar (Rm. 3:4).

In the end it is obvious to everyone (believers and unbelievers alike) Mr. Camping was wrong, but it is still true that "the Day of the Lord will come. . ." (2 Pt. 3:9-10). It is still true we will all "stand before the judgment seat of God." (Rm. 14:10). It is still true "each one of us will give an account of himself before God." (Rm. 14:12). The question is as valid as ever, "Are you ready for the Judgment Day?" Thankfully, there is still time. Do something you need to do today. Don't delay. Remember these words of our Savior, "We must work the works of Him who sent Me as long as it is day; night is coming when no one can work." (Jn. 9:4).



Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 72

72:1 Endow the king with your justice, O God, the royal son with your righteousness.

In the New Testament, we are called upon to remember our government officials in our prayers. These men and their ways affect the lives of the people under their authority. This Psalm was written on behalf of a king – possibly Solomon. The people saw the king as God's agent on earth to do what was right. A righteous official brings much good to his people whereas a wicked ruler harms his people. Consider the following thoughts provided by the people in behalf of their king.

The first request is for justice and righteousness. A king will make judgments. These judgments need to be just and based upon righteousness. He was expected to defend the afflicted, to save the children of the needy and to crush the oppressor. A king like this is refreshing. He is illustrated as rain falling on a mown field. The field appreciates the water and it will grow and flourish. The same is true of a people with good rulers. His righteousness will bring prosperity to the people and other nations will pay him tribute. His people are precious to him and he will deliver, take pity, save and rescue his people in their various needs. In return the people will shout, "Long may he live!" They will pray for him and bless his name. What a blessing to serve a righteous king.

Read this Psalm once again and read it in mind with Jesus as the righteous king. He is the King of Kings. Righteousness and justice are provided by him. Where people allow him to be their king blessings and prosperity abound. Jesus cares about his people. He stands ready to save those who call upon him. When we understand his great love, we will praise his glorious name.
