Where were you September 11, 2001? I believe all of us who are old enough can vividly recall not only where they were but also many of the events of that tragic day. As we all know the world was changed in many ways after September 11. We were all soon introduced to a man who claimed responsibility for those attacks and was immediately public enemy number one. That man of course was Osama Bin Laden. Thousands of our service men and women along with billions of tax dollars were eventually employed in the hunt for Bin Laden. Finally after nearly ten years and thousands of lives lost (both U.S. and foreign) Osama Bin Laden was brought to justice by American forces. As the news spread, people all around the world rejoiced and praised these actions. Many exclaimed, "Finally he is dead!"; "He did not deserve to live!" while others in the world proclaimed him a hero. This event was really bitter sweet and how we should feel in light of the teachings of Christ is a little complicated.

First, the U.S. was justified in carrying out these actions against Bin Laden. God gives government authority to execute wrath upon evil-doers (Romans 13). Bin Laden was guilty of crimes worthy of death. I support the USA in their military action.

Second, consider God does not want anyone to perish but for all to come to repentance (2 Pt. 3:9). Also He does not take pleasure in the death of the wicked (Eze. 18:23,32; 33:11). The fact was Bin Laden never saw his actions as evil or sinful and thus never saw the need for repentance. God is not rejoicing over the death of Bin Laden because a soul that has sinned has died and will spend eternity in Hell (Eze. 18:4; Rm. 6:23, Rev. 21:8).

Third, we who are Christians have dual citizenship. We are citizens of both the U.S. and of Heaven (Phil. 3:20). While I am proud of our military and the decisive leadership of our President in this event, I must never lose sight of my Heavenly calling. It is okay to be patriotic and feel a surge of nationalism at times like this but we must also remember being citizens of Heaven requires us to seek first the Kingdom of God (Mt. 6:33). We must not react to such news in ways that will alienate those we are trying to reach for Christ. Remember nearly ten years ago thousands of people were rejoicing at the deaths of 3,000 innocent victims on September 11. Think of how you felt when you saw it.

Finally, we must realize the so called "War On Terror" is far from over. There will always be evil and extremist bent on evil in the world. It is only a matter of time before another Bin Laden comes along or another terrorist strikes. As long as the world stands, Satan will relentlessly pursue those whom he may devour (1 Pt. 5:8).

Although it took years, justice was finally served. Remember no one is getting away with anything in the end (1 Tim. 5:24-25). At times like this instead of dancing in the streets, why not pray lasting peace and good can come from this?





Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 69

69:17 Do not hide your face from your servant; answer me quickly, for I am in trouble.

This Psalm is about a godly man that is suffering. He described his troubles as sinking into a watery pit. As he called to God for help, he could barely keep his head above the water. His troubles were due to his enemies. They had shown him hate and he pleaded with God to deliver him from the deep waters of hate. He asked God for favor, for a display of his great love and for salvation. He also asked that his enemies be charged with crimes and for their names to be blotted out of the book of life.

As the writer examined his situation, he had a desire that should be ours as well. As he went through his trouble, he did not want to be bad example. He said, "May those who hope in you not be disgraced because of me, O Lord, the Lord Almighty; may those who seek you not be put to shame because of me, O God of Israel." As we face difficult times people are watching how we handle ourselves. May we never give them reason to be offended by Christians. Even in tough times we must bring glory to God.

This Psalm is often applied to Christ. No less than seven thoughts are used by the New Testament writers. John used verses 4 and 9. Romans quoted verses 9 and 22. Matthew used verse 21 and Mark applied verse 20. Acts used verse 25 to chose Matthias to replace Judas. As you read this Psalm, think of Christ upon the cross calling out to God. This will give even more meaning to this song.
