# How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

Since I first began preaching, I have tried to be a serious Bible student. I have tried very hard to learn as much as I can about the Bible. One of the many things I have grown to love about God's word is how I can read it repeatedly and still learn something each time. Bro. James Meadows who has preached the gospel for over 55 years (and has forgotten more Bible than I have ever known) has stated, "The more I learn about the Bible, the more I realize how much I do not know." Some of the things I learn are as follows. Sometimes I am reminded of something I have previously learned. Sometimes I make a connection between several different scriptures. Sometimes I learn something completely new to me. Sometimes I pay careful attention to specific words I have not given a lot of thought to before. While studying Ephesians, two important words caught my attention, redemption and forgiveness. In chapter 1 Paul is discussing the things available only to those "in" Christ and thus in His church. Verse seven reads, "In Him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace" (Eph. 1:7).

Redemption and forgiveness are both central to the teaching of Christianity. There is great significance to placing them together in the same verse. Although they are somewhat related, they do not mean the same thing.

Redemption carries with it the idea of buying back something. More specifically it has reference to the buying back of a slave in regard to his freedom. Seeing that everyone who commits sin is the servant of sin (Jn. 8:34), all are enslaved to it and are in need of redemption. The price demanded and the price paid to ransom us from our sins is the blood of Christ (1Pt. 1:18-19).

As if the thought of redemption was not enough, forgiveness takes it even farther. Not only did Jesus pay the price demanded for my sins, but He forgave me the debt I owed. No one would do this.

Despite all of the ideas and notions people come up with about how one is redeemed and forgiven, God said they are available in only one place, "in" Him, that is "in" Christ. Galatians 3:27, tells us how one gets into Christ is through Baptism. "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ." It is at the point of baptism and only that point one is simultaneously, redeemed from their sins and forgiven. "In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace" (Eph. 1:7). Are you redeemed? Are you forgiven?

# **Summits of the Psalms** By: Joe Macer

Psalm 76

76:12 He breaks the spirit of rulers; he is feared by the kings of the earth.

We do not know with surety when this Psalm was written. It fits in well with the time that Sennacherib's army surrounded Jerusalem. Surrounding the city of God and King Hezekiah, Sennacherib threatened destruction and death for the Jews. He did not realize that he was not just fighting a group of people but also their God. The Scriptures tell how Sennacherib mocked God and considered him to be nothing. He was arrogant and thought he was in control. On that night an angel of the Lord slaughtered 185,000 soldiers encircled around the city. This is how the Psalmist described the scene. "Valiant men lie plundered, they sleep their last sleep; not one of the warriors can lift his hands. At your rebuke, O God of Jacob, both horse and chariot lie still." Simple words from the mouth of God destroyed an army. The Psalmist's response was, "You alone are to be feared." Do we have the proper respect and fear for God? We should not think of him as a man or as some fun loving grandfather in the sky. He is the Almighty God deserving of our proper respect and obedience. The Psalm concluded by calling upon God's people to fulfill their vows. God is not some object to be toyed with. Take seriously your obligations to him. Keep your words and keep your promises. Those that survive his wrath will bring him praise. May each of us be found praising him throughout eternity.
