Over the past few years the use of social media sites has become increasingly popular. By far, Facebook has become the most popular with over five-hundred million users worldwide. I have personally been using this service for a few years myself. It is nice to be able to keep up with people you know but do not get to see very often without having to call or visit everyone. It is also great to find long lost friends/ family members and reconnect with them. It is great to find out important things such as a marriages, births, deaths, etc. . . There are many wonderful benefits of the use of Facebook and social media in general. But for all the good there are always many bad things.

Over the past few years of using Facebook, I have personally witnessed many shocking and inappropriate things. There are groups and pages dedicated to promoting immorality and sin. Groups that belittle Christ and groups that promote the homosexual agenda, etc. . . These can and should be avoided (1 Thess. 5:22).

I have also witnessed many people disregarding/ allowing their children to disregard the intended age limit. No one under the age of 13 is allowed to have a Facebook page. Part of this is due to Facebook's own privacy settings and their desire to provide an age appropriate experience for young users by blocking certain content. However, when children change their age and parents allow them to, thinking this is no big deal, the reality is it is lying. If we are going to allow lying in something seemingly small, what else will we allow? How different is this from having a fake driver's license?

Another alarming concern is the complete lack of discretion. With summer in full swing far too many Christians have posted near naked pictures of themselves and their friends at the pool, beach, lake, etc. . . Far too many Christians have even posted pictures of themselves at bars or parties where others (and quite possibly themselves) are drinking alcohol, etc. . . I know it is not my place to police other people's actions (nor will it ever be) but realize when you place these things on Facebook, you are allowing everyone else to see them. Remember most importantly if you post it or not, God sees all. "For the eyes of the Lord are toward the righteous, and His ears attend to their prayer, but the face of the Lord is against those who do evil" (1 Pt. 3:12). It is shameful when Christians appear to be so "faithful" to God on Sunday's but apparently live questionable lives the rest of the week.

To sum it all up, Facebook can be and is used for many great purposes. However, we must be careful to ensure, no matter what we are doing, our lives are pleasing to God (Mt. 5:16).



Psalm 77

77:5 I thought about the former days,

the years of long ago.

A great distress had come upon the writer. He called out to God. At night he stretched out his hands in prayer. He desired comfort and yet none came. He was perplexed by the inactivity of God. His spirit grew weak and he could not close his eyes in sleep. These questions passed though his mind: Will the Lord reject forever? Has his unfailing love vanished forever? 
