The question is, "Do you enjoy cleaning, filing and perhaps even throwing away some of the stuff you have collected? I confess to being a person who likes things to be clean and organized but I am not the one who enjoys doing the work.

But before we get our minds stuck on throw away thing like old documents and broken furniture, let's look at another kind of "Junk" that needs to be thrown away. We need to sit down and decide what goes and what stays of all the junk we have accumulated in our hearts over the years. Then perhaps we can write something in our dairy that sounds like this:

"Last week I threw out WORRY. It was getting old and out of date anyway. Besides that, I had so much of it around that it was oppressing my spirit.

Also, I found an old volume dedicated to MY PAST. I looked at it briefly and decided it was something I didn't need to dwell on anymore. Some of it's memories had crippled me and kept me from accomplishing great things. So in the trash it went.

I threw away SOME WORDS which I no longer found useful. Things such as "must" and I ought to" and "it's just my duty" have been banished from my vocabulary.

The things I KEPT, however, were significant. I substituted FATIH in the place of worry. I replaced concern for the past with my hope in the FUTURE. My former words of duty have been replaced by "I LOVE GOD" and "I'M PRAYING FOR YOU."

This was more than a vocabulary change. My whole way of thinking has changed. When I quit worrying, I started having faith in God. When I quit letting my memories of the past cripple me, I suddenly discovered my vision for the future. When I quit depending solely on myself, then I discovered God and His power.

Let's be honest we all have some things we need to throw away. The question is when will we do it?



Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 74

74:9 We are given no miraculous signs; no prophets are left, and none of us knows how long this will be.

The writer considers himself to be one of the sheep of God's pasture. He had seen terrible things come upon God's people and all he could do was to ask why. He felt as if God had rejected them and not just for a short time but forever. He had not forgotten God but wonders where God had gone. We will not likely see the devastation that the Israelite nation observed but in our troubles we can share his feelings. We sometimes wonder where God has gone. The fact is that he is still there and waiting for us to call upon him. Think about some of the following thoughts presented by the Psalmist.

The author wanted to know what was wrong. Why does your anger smolder? It is wise to look at ourselves when trouble comes. Am I in a right relationship with God? Have I made right choices? Second, he asked God to remember the people you purchased of old – especially Mt. Zion. They were God's people just as Christians are today. God does not need to be reminded and yet we find this thought often in recorded prayers. It does remind us that God is in control and does care for his people. Third, he called God's attention to the destruction and the mocking of his name by enemies. He was asking for God to show his strength against those that hate him. He stated, "Rise up, O God, and defend your cause." And fourth, he reminded himself of the stories passed down through the generations that showed the power of God. He is the God that established the sun and moon; he split open the sea and conquered Leviathan. The creator opened up springs and dried up rivers. God can bring about his desired results. When we find times of frustration and feelings of abandonment by God, we would be wise to remember some of the thoughts presented by this Psalmist.
