A good friend of mine named Kevin Cleary, recently raised this important question and wrote the following. I want to ask you to take a moment and think about something Christians often do not contemplate. What if there is not God? You say, Kevin that's awful to even think about, I am absolutely certain that there is a God. I still want you to humor me just for a moment and think about your life without God.

You would wake up in the morning and not pray or study the Bible because that would make no sense at all. You would eat breakfast. After you are dressed and ready off you go to work. You joke with your friends about co-workers, situations in the news, tell of some events in your life. At lunch you don't pray, there is no reason to talk about what you did at worship, or bring up Jesus, or share the good news with your friends. On the way home you stop at the bank and find your balance is okay and you can probably put a little more in savings. Then you stop at the mall where you ogle a member of the opposite sex as you walk into the drug store for some needed personal items. When you arrive home you unload your stuff put on some comfortable cloths and find something to eat. You watch some TV maybe go to the gym and finally bed time.

Your day could look much different than that, mine does, but the point is to think about what you would do or wouldn't do if there were no God.

There are some things in the above description I especially want to consider. Sometimes I get up and start my day without taking any time with the Lord. When I do that I am living just like there is no God (1 Ths.5:17). There are times I stress about the future, when I do that I am living like there is no God (Mt. 6:31-34). There are times when I spend considerable time with non-Christians and never mention Jesus (Mt. 28:18-20). When I do that I am living like there is no God. There are times when I consider my resources and ask how this money, time, house, car, or whatever best serve me (2 Cor. 8:9). When I do that I am living like there is no God. There are times when I allow my body to dictate my actions putting it's comfort and pleasure ahead of what is right (1 Cor. 9:27). You guessed it, when I do that I am living like there is no God.

We love to talk about our love for God and our deep faith in him and we should. However loving God, having faith in him, and taking His Son as our Savior is a life changing thing. If we consider ourselves Christians we need to hear God when he says "faith without works is dead" (Jm. 2:26).

I think now you understand why I asked you to think about the question" what if there is no God". I wanted us to consider how much of our lives would be just the same. I wanted us to think of some of the things that we would do differently. Let's make it a regular practice to examine our lives and ask am I living as if I believe in God? There are millions who don't and part of the reason for that is that those who do don't let it show in their lives.

God, I know you are there, I love you and I long to serve you. Please help me to live every day not just knowing mentally that you are real but living out your reality in my reality.


Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer

Psalm 79

79:8 Do not hold against us the sins of the fathers; may your mercy come quickly to meet us, for we are in desperate need.

Enemy soldiers were throughout the land of Israel. The nations had invaded God's inheritance. Jerusalem had been reduced to rubble and foreigners had entered and violated the temple of God. Pools of blood were as common as water. Dead bodies were lying everywhere with birds eating the rotting flesh and no one was found to bury the dead. Prisoners had been carried off to the foreign nations and some of them were condemned to die. Nations were mocking the Jews and their God. Life was miserable. Imagine the devastation; imagine the death and the horror; imagine the fear and the uncertainty. The survivors cried out "How long, O Lord? Will you be angry forever?" All cried out for help and deliverance. They were hurt and offended when God was mocked by the heathen with questions like, "Where is their God?"

These actions caused them to call upon God with many thoughts. First, we are the sheep of your pasture and we want to praise you from generation to generation. This could not happen if things continued as they were. Second, they asked God to pour out his wrath on the nations who do not acknowledge him. Third, "do not hold against us the sins of our fathers" but show us mercy. And fourth, "pay back into the laps of our neighbors seven times." The writer wanted to be right with God. He desired mercy and justice and he wanted retribution towards his enemies. In times of trouble, look inward and see if sin is prevalent in our lives. Repent if it is there and plead for God's mercy. He answered Israel of old and he will answer today as well.
