2011 Theme "Do all in the name of the Lord"

How I See It. By: Brían Gregory

One of the most famous and popular stories from the Bible are the circumstances surrounding the birth of our Savior into the world. The story is unique and very relevant even today. Recorded for us in Matthew 1-2 and Luke 1-2, the birth of Jesus really gets very little attention in the overall gospel story.

One important point in this story that often comes to mind, is recorded for us by Luke, "there was no room for them in the inn" (Lk. 2:7). Mary and Joseph had returned to Bethlehem to be counted in the census (Lk. 2:1-3). Upon their return (with Mary likely in labor) they are desperately seeking a place to stay. With the inn full, they are forced to take refuge in an area where animals were kept, similar to a barn stall (Lk. 2:7). As we often read over this detail about there being no room at the inn, do we ever realize this was not the only time Jesus found Himself in this situation? Not to mention it still happens today.

There was no room for Jesus when He came to His hometown Nazareth (Lk.4:16-30). As His public ministry was unfolding and the evidence of His true identity was being reveled, many in his hometown rejected Him. There was no room for Jesus in the country of Gadarenes (Lk. 8:37). After performing a great miracle among them by healing a demon possessed man, the people feared Him and asked Him to leave. There is no room for Jesus in the business world. Much of the economic mess the world has faced the last few years has been in part caused by the greed and dishonesty of others. There is no room for Jesus in the educational system. School districts, teachers and parents would be slapped with big law suits if prayer, Bible reading and/ or Jesus were taught. There is no room for Jesus in the home. Far too often homes have plenty of room for T.V., boy scouts, entertainment, hunting trips, alcohol, arguments, etc. . . . But little or no room for Jesus. How strong would our nation be if more homes had Jesus? There is no room for Jesus in the religious world. The idea of religious pluralism (one religion is as good as another) has dominated many. With innovations, modernism and social agendas taking place over the truth of the gospel, there is little or no room for Jesus. As we think about this sobering reality, ask yourself, "Is there room for Jesus in my life?" If so how much room have I made for Him? Jesus doesn't want standing room only or a quiet corner, He wants to abide in your heart and mind.

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 83

83:18 Let them know that you, whose name is the Lord – that you alone are the Most High over all the earth.

This Psalm is a prayer on behalf of Israel. Many nations have joined together for the purpose of bring Israel down. Their intent was to destroy them to the point that they are not remembered ever again. The writer pleaded with God to act and to no longer be still. Help was needed right then. At least ten nations are listed that desired to bring harm to Israel. "O God, do not keep silent."

The Psalmist remembered his history. Sisera and Jabin were part of a coalition that wanted to defeat Israel. God used Deborah and Barak to defeat them. The alliance of Oreb, Zeeb, Zebah and Zalmunna were defeated by Gideon with the help of God. Historically many nations wanted to take the promised land from the Israelites especially in the time of the Judges. God came to their rescue and the writer asked for him to do it once again.

The author wanted his enemies to become like tumbleweed, like chaff blown away, like a forest burned by fire and like a terrifying storm. Let them feel the power of God. "Cover their faces with shame so that men will seek your name, O Lord." This last statement is an important lesson for us today. No one likes to have enemies which bring us either emotional or physical harm. We want it to stop but perhaps the greatest request of God is to ask that he changes hearts in order that our enemies seek him. Jesus taught that we should pray for our enemies. Our prayer should be that they seek him and a righteous life. Only then will the problems of this earth be solved.
