This past weekend a tragic accident occurred at the Indiana State Fair. During an out-door concert, an approaching storm suddenly sent an unexpected 70 mph gust of wind. This wind gust caused the stage and all of rigging to immediately collapse onto the crowd below. In the end, dozens were injured and five people lost their lives. Investigators say there was a storm approaching the area. Fair officials claim they were about to shut down the event and evacuate the area for safety. Obviously they were too late. Before restarting any of the fair events, a memorial service was held to honor the victims.

This tragic event was due in large part to "a freak event of nature" according to the Governor. While this is correct there are several things we can learn from it. First, Jesus recognized terrible things happen to unsuspecting/innocent people often. Jesus described two such events in Luke 13:1-5. He reached the same conclusion with each. Just because tragic things happen to people does not mean they are worse sinners than anyone else. People have long equated, suffering as a punishment for sin. All throughout the book of Job, his friends are doing just that (e.g. Job. 8:1-7). Yet, Jesus warns, "if you do not repent, you will likewise perish" (Luke 13:3, 5). Second, officials knew of an approaching storm and warned if it worsened they would shut the concert down. However, their failure to act soon enough cost five people their lives. The same is true with the gospel. There is a terrible storm fast approaching. God describes it as a place called Hell (Rev. 21:8). The ability to warn others comes in the gospel message (Rom. 1:15-17). Although it is never up to us to make someone believe it, we still have the obligation to share it with others. God told Ezekiel, He had set him as a watchmen to warn Israel (Eze. 3:18 -21). If he failed to do so, God would hold him accountable. Some dismiss themselves from the gospel with others by saying, "I cannot teach, etc. . ." Yet, they fail to realize the best way to do so is through living the gospel before others. Third, we learn life can be lost quickly and unexpectedly. I am confident none of the people involved woke up that morning knowing it would be their last day. If they had all known what was going to happen, they would have lived that day differently. I suppose they would have said, one last "I love you", one last "goodbye" or "I am sorry". Hopefully, they would have made the effort to make things right with God. Whether today or tomorrow is your last day or mine, is not important. How we are living our life now and if it is right with God is what is most important (Heb. 9:27).
