I recently read the following in an article by Steve Higginbotham. This view is expressed by many people without even realizing it. He writes: A few years ago I overheard a man talking about some rather shady business practices in which he had participated. That a man would be dishonest in business shouldn't be all that shocking to me, but what was shocking to me was that this man was a Christian. When asked about how he could conscientiously engage in such activities, he said, "Business is business and religion is religion."

Not long ago, I listened and watched as a presidential candidate stated that he believes life begins at conception, but in spite of that belief, he supported the right of women to abort their babies. He made it clear that his stance was due to the face that his religious convictions were religious convictions and had nothing to do with politics and the laws of the land.

These are examples of "compartmentalized religion." For many people religion is only a part of their being. It only impacts what they do on Sunday. It has no impact on their business ethics, their relationship with their neighbors or their politics. Imagine trying to sustain any other relationship in the same manner. Imagine a married businessman who, while on business trips, frequented "houses of ill-repute." What would his wife or anyone else think if he offered the following explanation: "I do love my wife and am totally committed to her when I am with her, but I'm on the road now, and what happens on the road is a totally different matter."

Surely we all see how foolish this is and no self-respecting person, male or female would put up with such a spurious standard of conduct. Thus being true, what makes us think that God would tolerate this same standard?

As convenient as compartmentalized religion may be for some, it just doesn't pass the test of Scripture. Jesus said that if you wanted to be His disciple you had to give all your heart to Him, not just a small compartment (Matt. 22:37). Do not short change God (and yourself) with this compartmentalized view of religion. If you are a Christian, you have sold out to God completely: body, soul and spirit. . . it all belongs to Him. Do not try to cheat God of what is rightfully His (1 Cor. 6:19-20).

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 85

85:6 Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you?

In days gone by, God had shown favor to his people. He gave them the promised land with all the blessings associated with it. He delivered his people on many occasions and when sin was the reason for their downfall, he forgave them. His anger was set aside when his forgiveness was given. The writer is once again begging for God's favor. He asked that God restore them once again and remove his displeasure from the nation.

Two key words are used by the Psalmist. He asked for restoration and revival. They needed to be restored to a proper relationship with God. Reconciliation must take place. When we have left God, we need to be restored. The relationship must be resumed. A second need is revival. Anything we do over and over again can become routine and in so doing we lose our zeal and enthusiasm. Focus on the great blessings both here and in eternity found in serving God. One of the great needs of the church today is revival. If restoration is needed, do not delay. If revival is needed, then begin to do better. Pray that God will help and lead the way.

The Psalmist is looking to the land to show the blessings of God. The land yielding its harvest will show God is looking out for them. He is also looking to see salvation, love, faithfulness, righteousness and peace. These are also demonstrations of the blessing of God. May these be seen in our lives as well.
