Over the past two weeks my family has experienced its fair share of grief. First was the death of my wife's grandmother. Then on the way home from her funeral, my sister called to tell me our grandmother was near death. On Thursday of last week she finally passed away at the age of 91. I admit it feels strange no longer having a Granny or any grandparents. I have had the privilege of being close to each of my grandmothers. My maternal grandmother died when I was sixteen followed by the loss of my grandfather five years later. With the loss of my grandmother it closes an important chapter in my life. However, knowing what I know about Granny makes this loss so much easier. First and foremost, my Granny was a faithful New Testament Christian. She was very actively involved in her congregation. She spent nearly 30 years organizing, grading and mailing the Bible Correspondence courses they offered. She enjoyed and collected the stamps from students in foreign countries. I recall the delight she felt when one of the students wanted to be scripturally baptized. I told her on a number of occasions there will be people in Heaven because of her work. I also loved and admired how she always had a Bible answer for any Bible question I had. If she did not know she would do the best she could and find the answer later. Due in part to her encouragement, I eventually wanted to preach. I wonder what I would have done if she did not know or want to help me learn the right answers when I had questions about the Bible? She was always concerned about the salvation of her family. It often worried her when she thought about the spiritual condition of her children and some grand children. Any time she could speak an encouraging word or make a plain truth statement about someone's need for salvation and living according to God's word she would. Anytime there was a gospel meeting nearby she would try her best to attend. Even in the last year of her life when her memory was failing her to the point she often did not know what day it was, she always remembered when it was Sunday and Wednesday because those were the days she could worship her Lord and study His word. Growing up rather poor, she learned from an early age the value of hard work and was proud of it. She knew the secret to living contently well within her means. She never had a lot of money but always had money because she spent it wisely and saved. She loved U.T. football and suddenly became an Indianapolis Colts fan after Payton Manning went to play for them. She loved life, but she loved the idea of living eternally with her Savior far more and made the right preparations to do so. Because of her influence it was always so much easier to do right and want to do right when she was around. I am forever grateful for all she taught and encouraged me to be.

Summits of the Psalms

Psalm 95

95:6 Come let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker;

God is our Maker and our Creator. He owns us. It is his right to demand from us whatever he desires. In creating man, God gave man the choice to respond to God or to rebel against him. God does not force us to make either choice. Which have you made?

One choice is to bow down to God. He has given us life and everything needed for living and salvation. Out of respect and honor for him we should bow and kneel before him. Do we have the proper respect and reverence for God? He controls the world from the highest mountain to the deepest depth. God has chosen people as his special creation. He desires that we be a part of his flock although he will not force us. As part of his flock, he will show us special care. He will meet our needs. What a precious promise this is!

The Psalmist reminds us of people that made that choice long ago. They tested God and tried him. Will heaven be your home or will you be refused entrance? Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your heart.

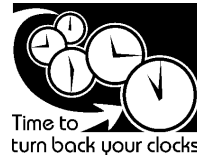
