With the Christmas season officially underway, many people have been thinking about their finances and how much they can and cannot spend on Christmas presents. As those wish lists turn into the reality of I can or cannot afford it, we sometimes think about winning the lottery or finding a hidden fortune somewhere. The idea of having a huge lump sum of money given to us is appealing to everyone. Imagine for a moment if someone gave you a blank check to pay off all of your debt no matter how much you owed, 50,000, 100,000, 1,000,000, etc. . . Whatever you needed to be debt free would be yours. What would you do? How would you react? Would you be responsible and live debt free the rest of your life? Would you even accept such a gift?

On one occasion God gave King Solomon what amounted to a blank check from Heaven. God told Solomon He would give him anything he asked for (1 Kgs. 3:5). As Solomon ponders this great opportunity, he finally asks for wisdom and an understanding heart to properly guide God's people (1 Kgs. 3:6-9). God, of course, granted this to him and even more because he did not ask for selfish things such as a long life, wealth or protection from his enemies.

As great as that occasion was, through the blood of Christ, God has written a blank check to the whole world to cover our debt of sin (Eph. 1:7; 1 Jn. 2:2). It is possible to live a life free from the burdens and debt of sin. No longer do you stand condemned (Rm. 8:1). No longer are you dead in your trespasses and sins (Eph. 2:1). Just like being offered a blank check would require you to accept it and deposit it into your account to receive the benefits, one has to accept the blood of Christ to receive its benefits. Through our faith and coming into contact with the blood in baptism (Rm. 6:3-4), we receive the benefits of forgiveness and salvation. In appreciation of this gift freely offered to us through His grace, we act responsibly and live faithful Christ-like lives. With this in mind we should all be thankful God paid the price for something none of us could afford, salvation.
