2011 Theme "Do all in the name of the Lord"

How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

In recent weeks I after completing another reading of the entire New Testament, I decided to focus my personal study upon the Old Testament for a while. So often many people fail to understand and appreciate this portion of the word of God. I have even heard people say they do not like it very much. While it is true it is greatly neglected, it is important to know and understand the Old Testament for several reasons. Consider the following.

First, it is inspired scripture and this alone makes it important for us to study and understand (2 Tim. 3:16-17). Second, it gives us a fuller and deeper understanding of all of God's revelation. It helps us understand and see the big picture. Third, it helps us better understand and interpret the New Testament. Many of the customs and events in the New Testament have their origins in the Old Testament. Forth, it helps us better understand and appreciate Jesus. Jesus comes from an Old Testament context. It contains over threehundred prophecies about Jesus, written hundreds of years before He came to earth. For example, they predicted His lineage (Isa. 11:1,10), His unusual birth (Isa. 7:14), His death (Psa. 22) and even His being sold for thirty pieces of silver (Zec. 11:12). We must also remember, since the New Testament was not written until several years after His death Jesus never read it. So, the Old Testament was the Bible He read and the stories He knew. If for no other reason but to learn more about Jesus, this alone would be a sufficient cause to study the Old Testament. Fifth, it reveals to us how God deals with His people as a whole (Israel) and individually (David and Abraham). There are many connections made by New Testament writers such and Paul and Peter between the church and Israel. There are many lessons for the church to learn from Israel's mistakes (Rom. 15:4). As individuals we can learn much about being faithful to God and how He will reward a life of faith from David and Abraham. Finally, we can see the relevance of God's word in our lives today. Although these stories and events took place thousands of years ago, their message still reads much like a modern day newspaper. There is still violence, people turning away from God, drunkenness, mocking God, social injustice and oppression, etc. . . The truth is, times have changed but people have not. So as you read the Bible, be sure you take time to read, understand and appreciate the value of the Old Testament. You will be greatly blessed when you do.

Summits of the Psalms By: Joe Macer Psalm 58

58:11 Then men will say, "Surely the righteous still are rewarded; surely there is a God who judges the earth."

One bothersome aspect of life is to observe wicked rulers being successful in all that they set out to do. They are not just or fair men. Violence and injustice are resorted to in order to accomplish their desires. They care not who gets in their way. This passage compares them to a cobra. A charmer had captured the cobra and charmed the snake by his music. Eventually the cobra stopped his ears and in doing so he is ready to strike and to kill. What an easy illustration to understand. These men were evil and their entire life is summed up as wayward and wicked.

The Psalmist called upon God to confound their ways. He asked God to break out their fangs. A cobra without fangs is powerless and he is not dangerous. As the king of the beasts – lions – he asked that their fangs be removed. As a slug melts away, he wanted the wicked to disappear. And again as a stillborn child does not see the sun he wishes the same for these wicked leaders. Wickedness can make life difficult. The writer was waiting for God to act on behalf of the righteous. The righteous will be glad when they are avenged by God. Still today it is hard to understand why evil is so prevalent in this world. As Christians we must realize that God is in control and he will in due time make everything right. The Psalmist concluded with two thoughts. First, the righteous are still rewarded. They are not forgotten. And second, there is a God who judges the earth. God is the judges who sees all and knows all and he will judge everyone according to the things done while in the body. Evil may appear to have the upper hand but in truth it never will.
