# How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

The occasion to serve is something we must ever look for and jump on when it comes. Some were able to serve in bigger ways by spending a lot of time here setting up or assisting in some other way. Some were able to serve in smaller ways by making cookies or something else. No matter how big or small the service may seem to others, every bit of it was equally important to this church and to God.

It is true when we think about being servants that some are able to do a little more than others. It is equally true everyone has different abilities, talents and opportunities. Due to limitations both physical and otherwise some are unable to do as much as they would like to. Yet, once again this does not make them or the work they do any less important or significant. God recognizes this very thing. For example, the church at Corinth was deeply and sharply divided over a number of things among which included the use of the miraculously imparted spiritual gifts. Those who could speak different languages felt this was the greatest gift of all. In short they were saying they were better and more important than others because of what they could do. In chapter 12 Paul addresses this particular argument and compares the proper functioning of the physical body with the spiritual body. Just as no part of our bodies claim they are more important/ better than any other part no one in the church should either. We all know as Paul aptly points out every part of our body works together to make us complete. Although every part may not have an equal function (i.e., my smallest toe does not work like my thumb) each is still important because they work together to make us complete and whole.

Never underestimate your value to the church or the value of your service. Never think because you cannot do as much as others or as much as you would like to that it is not needed or worth doing. Everything we do for God counts. He knows and understands our circumstances. With that said, let's not excuse ourselves from serving God through serving others.
