Over the past few months life has become really busy for my wife and me. Specifically on September 25, 2012 is when things started to pile on. This was the day my princess (a.k.a. Alaina) was born. The addition of a fourth child into a family with three rowdy and active boys makes for a little chaos. It seems life is busy in general. We purposefully fill our schedules with things and then complain about how we have no time or we are just too busy. It is unfortunate how we have made "busy" out to be a god. We worship at its altar often with things like work, sports, hobbies, shopping, etc. . . .

While it is true we do live busy lives, there are still only 24 hours a day and 365 a year. We get so caught up in life and things that keep us busy, time starts to slip away from us with our paying attention to it. For example, I cannot believe February is almost over. It really seems like it should only be the first of the month instead of the last. Despite all of the things we find to fill our time with, God has warned us about that very thing. "Therefore be careful how you walk, not as unwise men but as wise making the most of your time, because the days are evil" (Eph. 5:15-16). That's right, God warns us that we must make the most of our time. Obviously some days are better spent than others but how can I make the most of the time I have?

First, prioritize. I always find it interesting that we can find time to do the things we really want to do. You know the games, concerts, trips to the lake or river, nights out with the friends. Yet, somehow we cannot make it to church on a regular basis and our spiritual life suffers greatly. This is really a matter of priorities. Make God your top priority, don't just say it do it and see how much your life is changed for the better (Mt. 6:33).

Second, take time and make time. Sometimes you just have to purposefully stop and do it. We all put off things that need to be done and sometimes we have to find time to do them by making the time. As His popularity was growing and He could no longer show His face in public without being swarmed, Jesus still sought time alone in prayer and quiet time with God. Mark tells us He got up before day light (Mk. 1). Luke records many occasions when He prayed alone (Lk. 8-9). Jesus made time for God and what was most important.

Third, multitask. Brain scientists tell us it is impossible to truly multitask (i.e., give equal attention to multiple things at once). We really only focus on one thing at a time. I do not mean text while driving and making coffee. What I mean is find ways to incorporate serving God and **showing** others about Jesus in your life daily. Be kind and go the extra mile at work for others. Treat others lovingly even those you don't like. Submit to your boss even if he is a jerk. Be a servant in your home, at work and public. Find a way to let your light shine. We all have 24 hours a day, how will you make the most of yours?

When You Were Called

I Corinthians 1:26 "Brothers, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth "

Do you ever stop to think about how you became a Christian? Most of us have a story to tell as to the process of making the decision to obey the Lord. Many of us had parents or a relative that taught us the gospel. Timothy developed his faith through his mother and his grandmother. Others have become Christians because of a friendship. Our friends are very influential in our lives and they certainly hold some persuasion with us. It may very well be that our contact with the gospel was through a neighbor or a coworker. These situations are due to relationships. Most of these people were somewhat similar to us. Consider the above statement given by the Apostle Paul in I Corinthians 1:26. Where will our greatest chance for success be when presenting the gospel?

In speaking of the Corinthian's congregation, Paul stated that not many were wise by human standards. Think of the vast majority of our university campuses today. How many welcome Christianity? How many discuss the gospel? It seems human wisdom leads the majority away from the Scriptures. Thankfully there are many highly intelligent Christians but most human intelligence leads people away from God. Secondly, he mentions influence. How many powerful people do you know that are Christians? With influence and power, the desire to serve the Creator is usually lacking. The third group is those of noble birth. In reading the Scriptures, it is rare to find royalty that was interested in the gospel. Often royalty sees the gospel as a threat to them. We must take the gospel to the entire world but where will we have the greatest probability for success? It will be with people much like ourselves and with those we can build relationships.
