2014 Theme "GOD's F.A.M.I.L.Y." Acts 2:37-47

How I See It. By: Brian Gregory

As I have been reading through the Bible this year, it has been rewarding to plumb the depths of God's word while being reminded of many things and most importantly learning more. It is almost like a treasure hunt or mining for gems. The more you search and the deeper you dig, the more you will find. Let me share with you one such gem I recently found.

Leviticus is Israel's holiness code. It's whole theme is how sinful man can approach a Holy God. The answer is found in sacrifices offered through a set apart priesthood and abiding by God's laws. As Moses directed this revelation to Israel, he had to consecrate (choose and set apart) the priests. As part of this process (Lev. 8-9), they were to be washed with water (symbolically and physically cleansing them), dressed in special garments and offer special sacrifices. Some of the blood of these animals was to be placed upon their right ear lobes, thumbs and big toes (Lv. 8:23). When we understand the why behind this the significance becomes much clearer. The right side was viewed as the principle side. Even today we raise our right hands to take an oath and shake with our right hands. When the blood was placed upon their ear lobe, they were to always hear God's word. The thumb meant they were to always serve the Lord. The toe meant they were to always walk in the way of holiness before God.

Since many O.T. things were foreshadowing and pointing to lots of N.T. things, here is some of the application for us. When we are baptized into the death of Christ (Rm. 6:1-4) we contact His blood. Thus we are washed in His sight and set apart for His service as priests (1 Cor. 6:11; 1 Pt. 2:9-10). Certain parts of our bodies have not been singled out but instead our entire body has been washed in His blood. Our special garments are now a life clothed in Christ (Gal. 3:27). The special sacrifice we offer to God is not a dead animal, instead we offer ourselves to Him as a living sacrifice (Rm. 12:1-2). So how much more should we who have been washed in baptism, covered in His blood and now clothed with Christ, always hear God's word, serve the Lord and walk in the way of holiness?

What God Can Do!

Philippians 1:12 "Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel."

Prison - what good can come from being in prison? If a minister today were to be sent to prison, it would be depressing. If the preacher was simply preaching what God's word says, it would feel devastating. Paul had been arrested and placed in chains. He was not free to go to the market place and talk of the Savior. He could not pack up and move to the next city to proclaim the way of salvation. Paul was limited but was the gospel? In writing the Philippians, he wanted them to know something. Paul was not bitter; he was not discouraged; instead he found reasons to rejoice. Prison was confining but the gospel was advancing. How amazing to see that Paul looked on the bright side of life and always saw blessings in his troubles.

How was the gospel advanced by Paul's imprisonment? First Paul's voice was not taken away. The palace guards heard about Jesus Christ. These men were chained to Paul. They soon learned how wise, gracious, humble, patient, dedicated and genuine this man was. Prisoners heard of the plan God had through his Son. Not only that, Paul had time to write many of the letters that he wrote to the early congregations. Even today we reap the benefit of his imprisonment. Another blessing was mentioned in the following verses. Most of the brothers were "encouraged to speak the word of God more courageously and fearlessly." Paul's imprisonment inspired others to do far more. Paul knew better than even most today that God can bring good out of what seems to be bad circumstances. Let's always keep our eyes open for how God is using both good and bad situations to advance his cause. Let's pray that God will use us to advance his cause.
