# How I See It. By: Brían Gregory

This weekend is a very popular religious holiday - Easter. The main focus of this time of year is upon the resurrection of Jesus Christ following His crucifixion. Although, there is no mention of Easter in the Bible (Acts 12:4 in the KJV should be translated Passover) or any indication early Christians celebrated this as a holiday, it is still an important time of year. This is an opportunity to talk about Jesus in a special way to many different people who might otherwise not think much about Him. Once we push past the candy, hams and egg hunts, we can examine what is the main focus of this season, the Resurrected Lord. With that in mind I want to share with you a few reasons why the resurrection is important and what it means to us as Christians.

1. Jesus' resurrection was verified by hundreds of witnesses. Jesus predicted His resurrection several times (e.g., Mt. 16:21) and was often misunderstood. Yet, exactly as He has predicted, it came to pass just as He said it. This was not a lie or a vision by some emotional disciples nor was His body hidden as was rumored early on. He was seen several times over 40 days by hundreds of disciples (Acts 1:3-4; 1 Cor. 15).

2. Jesus' resurrection proved beyond the shadow of a doubt who He was and is. Paul said He was declared to be the Son of God with POWER by the resurrection from the dead (Rm. 1:4).

3. Jesus' resurrection is the first fruits of ours (1 Cor. 15:20-29). The first fruits of the harvest were the promise that more like it would come. These were offered to God (Ex. 23:16, 19). The resurrection of Jesus is the promise more like it will come (Jn. 5:28-29).

4. Jesus' resurrection is the central fact of the gospel. In short it all hinges upon Him being raised from the dead. In other words if He did not then the church has no reason for existing and we have no hope and are to be pitied among all men for believing such foolish things (1 Cor. 15:12-19). Also consider how Peter boldly proclaimed the fact of the resurrection on the day the church began (Acts 2). Jerusalem was filled with people, many who had seen and heard Jesus and witnessed His death. All that had to be done was produce His body and the church would have never been. The fact the church is still alive and well today is a testimony to this fact.

#### **Think Before You Speak**

Proverbs 12:18 "Reckless words pierce like a sword, but the tongue of the wise brings healing."

Most of us have heard our mothers tell us to think before you speak. This was truly wise advice. Have we listened to this advice? Our tongues can make our life better or cause us much trouble. This motherly advice was based upon the Scriptures, especially many of the thoughts found in Proverbs.

Reckless words pierce like a sword. What is the purpose of a sword? The main purpose of a sword is to hurt or to kill. A sword will bring about bleeding.
