Effective immediately, I am sad to announce, South Gate will be closing its doors at the end of the month. We have run out of money and find it impossible to continue on. We hope everyone will remain faithful to the Lord and His work by placing membership in any of the surrounding congregations.

Of course this is not true, but think about how you felt when you read it. Many of you were shocked, some laughed, some were wondering why they did not know anything about this. I am sure some even stopped reading it. It is always interesting how so many people are willing to listen to and accept the first things they hear without ever checking the facts or verifying them elsewhere. Newspapers and news organizations print or announce retractions and corrections often when they have been wrong about what they reported. But what about the things we believe religiously? These are deeply held beliefs about our faith, churches we attend and the God we serve. How many times do we just believe what we have heard and go on without ever verifying it or checking the sources? Or how often do we simply dismiss what we hear because it does not line up with what we believe or want to believe? Again do we ever check the sources and verify the facts?

In the book of Galatians, Paul is having to defend much of what he has taught the churches there because someone came and taught what he identifies as, "another gospel" (Gal. 1:6-9). The heart of what they were being taught was that they (the Christians in Galatia) had to keep certain parts of the Law of Moses, especially circumcision, in addition to the teachings of Christ, in order to be saved. As he fights to correct this error among them, Paul takes a firm stand for the truth. He later asks "Have I become your enemy because I have told you the truth"? (Gal. 4:16). In short, they did not want to hear what Paul had to say because it was no longer what they believed. So often people become angry or dismissive of what they hear because it does not line up with what they already believe or want to believe. Yet, why not check it against the facts? Why not take time to investigate the truth? The reality is, what you believe may actually be wrong. We should all take the time and effort necessary to investigate and check the facts of what we believe and want to believe against the truth of God's word. In an age when anything goes and all opinions are said to be equally valid no matter how contradictory they are, it is vitally important to know the truth.
